Research context

The Good Parenting? Collaboration between Leiden University College and Ububele Educational and Psychotherapy Trust, started in 2021 with the transfer of a large number of handwritten and excel based home visit reports written by community lay mental health counselors as part of their routine visiting. One of the research questions of the collaboration is how to turn these reports into ethnographic data with the aim to collaboratively analyse these reports. Part of turning reports into data is compiling them in typed transcripts and coding them. Currently the team is working on two writing projects. One is on infant precarity and lay counselor responses to precarity. The second project is on the emotional labor. The projects contribute to the continuous reflection on the responsive parenting intervention implemented by Ububele. As part of these projects' we seek a student who wants to work on the data and collaborate within the larger team consisting of two PIs, a research intern from the Ububele side and a senior mental health lay counselor. The student's main work is to support the team in the data preparation and analysis

Students' tasks and activities

The student will transcribe a minimum of 30 handwritten reports. These reports have been sampled and form the basis of the analysis of the two above mentioned papers. When time is left the student will be asked to participate in the collaborative coding. The primary aim however is to prepare the raw data into actual transcripts
