



Language requirements – Bachelor's programmes

- For admission to **English-taught** bachelor's programmes you must be proficient in English.
- For admission to **Dutch-taught** bachelor's programmes you must be proficient in Dutch *and* English. However, you will only be asked to submit an English test result if after application, the English level in your previous education is found to be significantly lower than required.

Dutch language tests

Tests accepted

- Faculty of Science & Faculty of Medicine (LUMC): [Dutch TUL intermediate exam](#) from the Academic Language Centre or [Dutch NT2-II diploma](#).
- All other faculties: [Dutch TUL advanced exam](#) from the Academic Language Centre.
- Also accepted by all faculties: [CNAvT](#) Educatief Startbekwaam or Educatief Professioneel.

Exemptions

- Holders of an [International Baccalaureate™ Diploma](#) (IB DP) with Dutch B Higher or Dutch A SL/HL can be exempted from a Dutch test.
- If Dutch was included in your secondary school diploma, check our [diploma requirements list](#) to find out whether you can be exempted from a Dutch test.

English language tests

Results may not be more than two years old and must be obtained in one single test.

Tests accepted

- [IELTS](#): academic modules only, on paper or on computer
 - We do **not** accept the [IELTS Academic Online](#).
 - We do **not** accept IELTS General Training, or IELTS Indicator, or IELTS One Skill Retake.
- [*TOEFL](#): internet-based (IBT)
 - We do **not** accept The TOEFL IBT Home Edition™ or the TOEFL IBT Paper Edition™, except in the following situation only:
 - *you are unable to take an in-person test on location because test centres are inaccessible or closed due to unsafe conditions in a country.*
 - We do **not** accept the following types of test: TOEFL My Best™ scores (multiple test scores combined), TOEFL Essentials™ or institutional tests such as ITP.
- [Cambridge English Exam](#): C2 Proficiency or C1 Advanced, depending on admission criteria.

The above-mentioned organisations offer adaptations for students with special requirements. Consult the organisation website for details.


***New TOEFL grading scale 2026**

In January 2026, TOEFL introduced a new grading scale. Test certificates issued in 2026 and 2027 will show *overall* scores in both the old grading scale (0-120) and the new grading scale (1-6). *Component* or band scores will only be shown in the new grading scale. Leiden University's 2026-2027 overall score requirements will continue to be based on the old grading scale. If you took your test on or after 21 January 2026, you must meet the overall score requirement shown on our website in the old grading scale (0-120), and the component score requirements shown on our website in the new grading scale (1-6).

Before taking your English test

Always check that you are dealing with a genuine test centre. Unfortunately, fraudulent test centres and websites do exist. If in doubt, check directly with the central test organisation.

Exemptions

You can be exempted from submitting one of the above-mentioned English test results if:

- You have an [International Baccalaureate™ Diploma](#) (IB DP) taught in English or with English A HL.
- You completed your secondary or higher education in the USA, UK, Ireland, New Zealand, Australia, Canada (except French-taught programmes in Canada), Singapore, South-Africa or Malta*.
* This includes diplomas that are issued by schools/institutions from the above-mentioned countries that are located elsewhere but are accredited as part of the education system in the above-mentioned countries - if obtained after having attended for at least 2 years.
- You have a German Zeugnis der Allgemeinen Hochschulreife (Abitur) and English was included in your final year at least at Grundkurslevel.
- Exemptions may be granted on the basis of certain other educational diplomas. Check our [diploma requirements list](#) to find out whether your diploma might entitle you to an exemption.



In exceptional cases, students who otherwise qualify for an exemption but whose application documents cast doubt on their English proficiency, may be asked to sit an English exam.

How to submit your test results

- Upload a copy of your test results in the online application system.
- If you would like to submit a TOEFL IBT Special Home Edition™ or TOEFL IBT Paper Edition™ due to unsafe conditions (as specified under ‘Tests accepted’ above), also upload a document explaining the situation in your region so the university can verify if you qualify for this ruling.

Authenticity of test results

Be aware that applicants are responsible for ensuring that they submit authentic test results only. During the application phase, Leiden University has strict measures in place for the verification of English language test results. After arrival, should there be serious doubts about a student’s English proficiency, Leiden University reserves the right to ask the test organisation to perform additional authenticity checks. Instances of test fraud will be reported to the relevant authorities and will exclude you from studying at Leiden University.
