



It is **the longest Greenway** in Ireland 46 km




- **Ballyvoyle Tunnel and Viaduct**


built in the 1870s, blown up during civil war and rebuilt 1924

Great Western Greenway

- Westport – Newport (12km)
- Newport – Mulranny (18km)
- Mulranny – Achill (13km)
- Total 43 km

Planning for Great Western Greenway

- *How to get there*

Travel by train or bus to Westport, or a car (Mullrany , Newport, Achill)

- *How long to stay to make the best of the trip*

3 nights accommodation

- *How long does it take to complete*

Trip can be completed in one day however the parts of it can be tiring for not experience cyclist

Booking a bike

- Bike can be booked in Newport, there are number of stops where bike can be returned: Westport, Mulranny, Achill
- Shuttle bus included in a price

Day 1: Beginning in Newport

- The greenway became reality in 2010, when the section between Newport and Mulranny officially opened.
- The greenway in place of old railway between Westport and Achill closed in 1937



What to expect: Newport –Mulranny

- 18 km of an excellent scenery
- This section is the only section with on track refreshment stops

Nevin's of Newfield, Riverside Café

- The greenway is predominantly flat as for the most part was developed on the railway line

Mulranny to Achill

- Cycling time around 1,5 h along to Achill Sound
- More exposed to the elements provides magnificent views of Mayo's rugged coastline with Bellacragher Bay running by your side.




Day 2: Newport –Westport 12 km

- Cycling time : up to 1,5
- This is the shortest section of the Great Western Greenway
- “Sunday stroll” great connection between the two west Mayo towns.
- There are no services on this section, but being the shortest, it doesn't take long to complete.

Gorey, County Wexford


Is a small rural town with many secrets to offer family friendly trips and excursions for day trips or overnight stays





Irish Botanic Gardens, Glasnevin


- Open 10am – 5pm (10am – 6pm weekends)

- Can continue walk on Portmarnock beach (+2.5km)

- First bird sanctuary in Ireland
- 180+ bird species recorded
- Wildlife habitat
- Dollymount strand

Boooterstown Nature Reserve

- Marshland (only remaining marsh in South Dublin)
- Resting spot for migrating birds
- Freshwater & saltwater
- Blackrock Park nearby (1.5 Km)
