Awards Offered Through GAC

The following award categories are awarded through the annual Graduate Award Competition (GAC)

- Izaak Walton Killam Doctoral Scholarships
- Open Doctoral Scholarships
- Alberta Innovates Graduate Student Scholarships
- Special Awards (including select Indigenous/DEI Awards)
- FGS Awards open to all eligible applicants (including Alberta Graduate Excellence Scholarship (AGES) – International)
- Cumming School of Medicine Awards

Eligibility



Eligibility

- **Thesis-based students only**
- **You must meet the eligibility criteria for each award you are applying for.**
 - Terms of reference for the Killam, Open Doctoral, FGS, and Special Awards can be found on the [Graduate Award Database](#)
 - Terms for the Alberta Innovates Graduate Student Scholarships can be found at grad.ucalgary.ca/awards/award-opportunities/alberta-innovates
- **Killam and Open Doctoral categories:** require a first-class average in the last two completed years of study (full-time equivalent).
 - At the University of Calgary that is an **average of 3.5 or higher**

Deadlines



GAC Deadline

- Applications are submitted electronically through your Student Centre
- Deadlines vary by program, contact your Graduate Program Staff
- You may only submit one application, regardless of the number of programs you may have applied to
- Contact gsaward@ucalgary.ca immediately with details if:
 - If you have applied to multiple programs for admission
 - decline an offer from the program to which you have submitted your GAC application
 - are declined admission the program to which you have submitted your GAC application

Program Quotas

- **Killam Award**
 - Each graduate program is allocated a certain number of applications to forward
 - Some programs are more transparent than others in this regard (e.g., will inform students that have been forwarded). Please speak with your program in late February/early March if you have not been told either way.
- **All others (Open, Alberta Innovates, and Special/FGS Awards)**
 - All applications are forwarded to the competition, no Program quotas

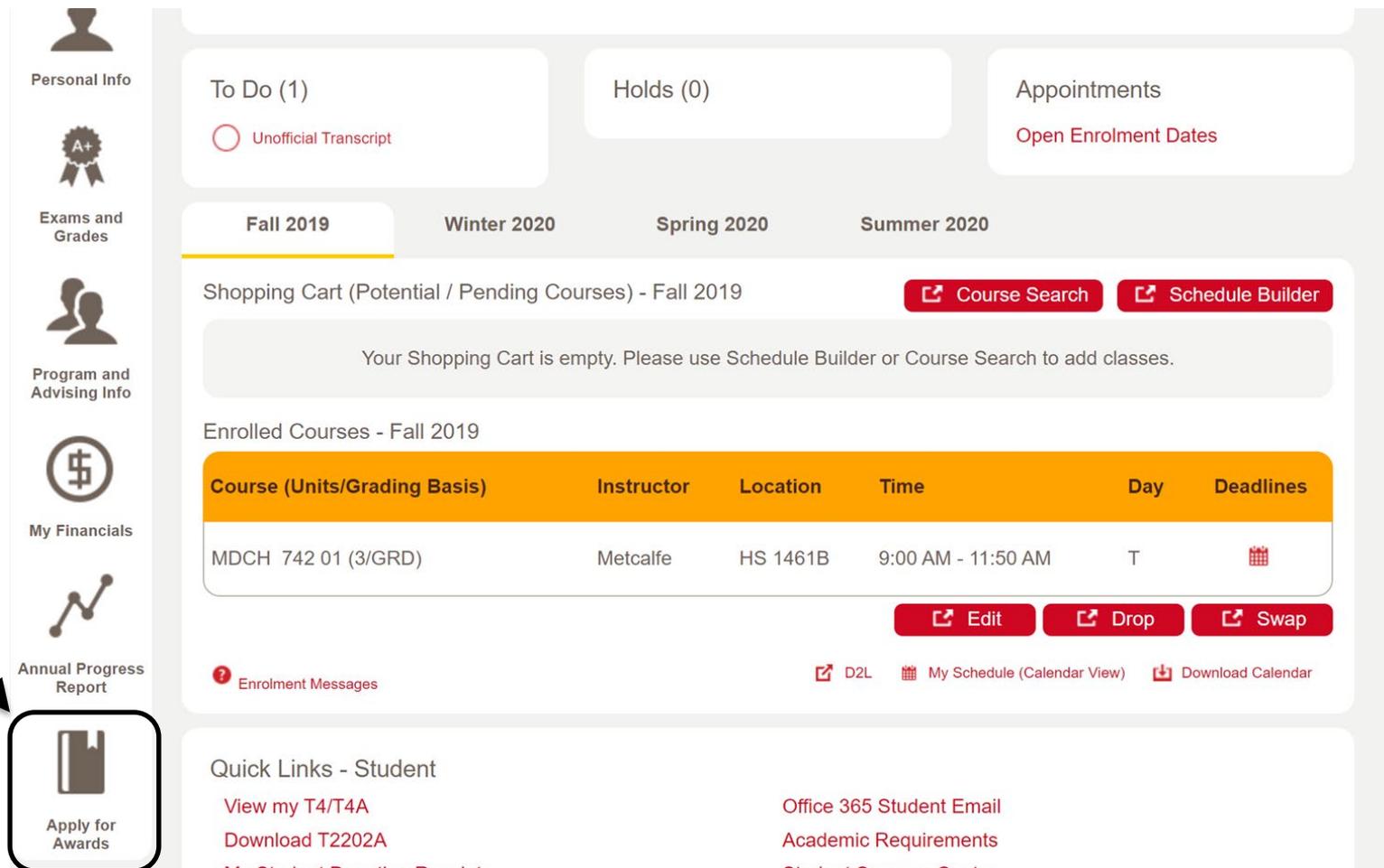

Application Components

- The online application requires the following
 - Award Selection
 - 2 References
 - Academic History
 - Scholarship / Award History (up to 10)
 - Title of research proposal (254 characters)
 - Research Abstract (250 words)
 - Research Proposal (800 words)
 - Bibliography (1000 words)
 - Presentations and Contributions (1000 words)
 - Leadership and Interpersonal Skills (800 words)
 - Allowable Inclusions (250 words)

References



References

- Fill out online form
- Names, email, organization
 - **Select notify:** They will receive an email with instructions and a deadline
- Ensure referee confirms receipt of email request
 - It may end up in the junk/spam folder!
- Ensure you “SAVE” the page once nominations are sent
- Submission of your application **does not** rely on submission of references

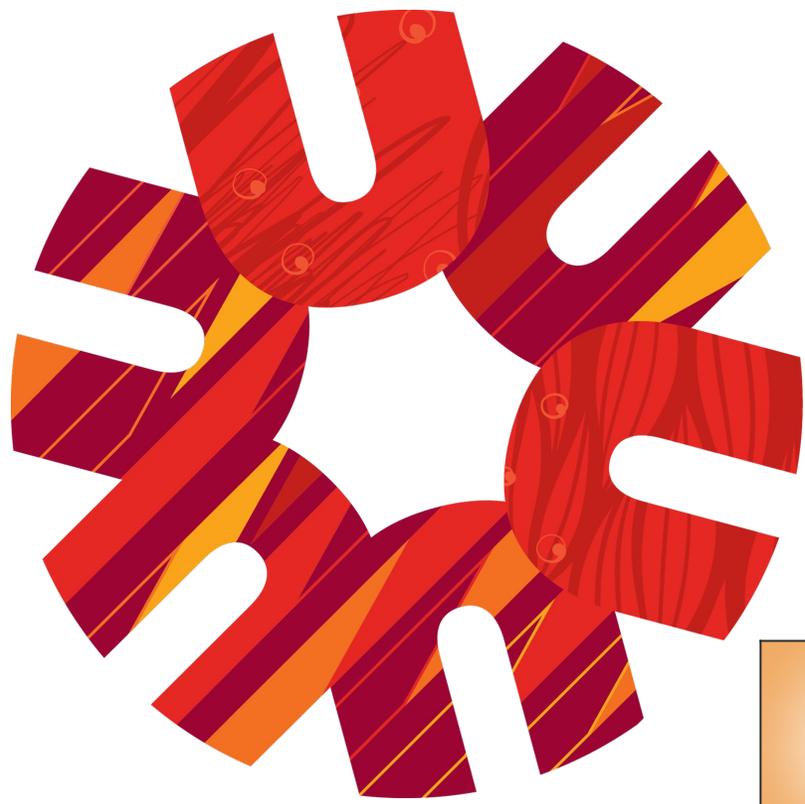


Academic History

- List **ALL** post-secondary institutions, whether or not you received a degree from those institutions
- If you are currently registered at UCalgary, list UCalgary!
- Ensure you delete all duplicate entries and add any missing degree data as required.
- Transcripts for all institutions will be uploaded by the Graduate Program Staff in the program for which you are applying for funding.

How to Create a Strong Application



How to Create a Strong Application

- **Start early**
 - Writing a good application takes time and planning
 - Make a schedule so that you can meet the competition deadlines and submit with confidence
- **Know what you are applying for**
 - Read the terms of reference to confirm you meet the eligibility criteria and understand what is required to complete the application
- **Feedback in Key**
 - Get colleagues, supervisors, peers, etc. to proof your application
