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If translated Regulation does not conform to its Japanese original, the Japanese version shall prevail.**

# 筑波大学学群学則

## University of Tsukuba School Regulations

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## 第1章 総則 Chapter 1 General Provisions

(目的)

第1条 この法人規則は、国立大学法人法（平成15年法律第112号）第2条に規定する国立大学法人筑波大学（以下「法人」という。）が設置する筑波大学の学群及び総合学域群の修業年限、教育課程、収容定員その他学生の修学上必要な事項を定めることを目的とする。

(Purpose)

Article 1 The purpose of these Corporate Regulations is to stipulate the necessary particulars concerning the course term, the education curriculum, the enrollment capacity, and other matters relevant to the education of students of the schools and School of Comprehensive Studies of the University of Tsukuba as a National University Corporation (hereinafter referred to as the “corporation”) prescribed in Article 2 of the National University Corporation Act (Act No. 112 of 2003)<sup>2</sup>.

(定義)

第1条の2 この法人規則において「学群」とは、学士課程において教育課程を実施するために設置する学群、学類、グローバル教育院及びグローバル教育院に置く学位プログラム（学士課程の学位プログラムに限る。以下「学位プログラム」という。）をいう。ただし、第1条の3、第2条の2第1項、第19条第4項、第20条、第21条第1項、第30条第2号及び第55条にあっては、学士課程において教育課程を実施するために設置する学群をいう。

(Definition)

Article 1-2 As used in these Corporate Regulations, the term “school” means a school, college, the School of Integrative and Global Majors, and degree program in the School of Integrative and Global Majors installed to implement an education curriculum in a college program (limited to a degree program of a college program; hereinafter referred to as “degree program”); provided however, that for Article 1-3, Paragraph 1 of Article 2-2, Paragraph 4 of Article 19, Article 20, Paragraph 1 of Article 21, Item (ii) of Article 30, and Article 55, it means a school installed to implement an education curriculum in a college program.

第2章 学群・学類等の目的、修業年限及び在学年限並びに教育研究活動等状況の公表

## Chapter 2 Purpose of Schools and Colleges, Course Term, Maximum Enrollment Duration, and Official Report on Education and Research Activities, Etc.

(学群・学類・学位プログラム・総合学域群の目的)

第1条の3 学群又は学類ごとの人材の養成に関する目的その他教育研究上の目的（次項及び第4項において「人材養成目的」という。）は、学群長が部局細則で定める。

2 学位プログラムの人材養成目的は、法人細則で定める。

3 総合学域群の教育上の目的は、総合学域群長が部局細則で定める。

4 学群長が第1項の人材養成目的を定め、又は改廃する場合は、教育を担当する副学長の承認を得なければならない。

5 学群長が第1項の部局細則を定め、又は改廃する場合は、人文・文化学群、社会・国際学群、人間学群、生命環境学群、理工学群、情報学群及び医学群にあっては学類教育会議及び学群運営委員会、体育専門学群、芸術専門学群及び学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群にあっては専門学

群教育会議の議を経なければならない。

- 6 第2項の法人細則を定め、又は改廃する場合は、グローバル教育院会議の議を経なければならない。
- 7 総合学域群長が第3項の部局細則を定め、又は改廃する場合は、総合学域群運営委員会の議を経なければならない。
- 8 学群長又は総合学域群長は、第1項又は第3項の部局細則を定め、又は改廃した場合には、学長に報告しなければならない。
- 9 第25条以下において、部局細則及び法人細則を定める場合は、前4項の規定を準用する。

(Purpose of schools, colleges, degree programs, and the School of Comprehensive Studies)

Article 1-3 The purpose concerning the fostering of human resources and its other purposes of carrying out education and research for each school or college (means the “purpose of the fostering of human resources” in the following paragraph and Paragraph 4) shall be provided in the detailed department regulations<sup>3</sup> by the dean.

- 2 The purpose of the fostering of human resources in the degree program shall be provided in the detailed corporate regulations.
- 3 The educational purpose of the School of Comprehensive Studies shall be provided in the detailed department regulations by the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies.
- 4 If the purpose of the fostering of human resources in Paragraph 1 is provided, amended, or repealed by the dean, the approval of the vice president for education must be obtained.
- 5 If the detailed department regulations in Paragraph 1 are provided, amended, or repealed by the dean, the dean must undergo discussion at the Education Council of the college<sup>4</sup> and the School Operations Committee<sup>5</sup> for the School of Humanities and Culture, School of Social and International Studies, School of Human Sciences, School of Life and Environmental Sciences, School of Science and Engineering, School of Informatics, and School of Medicine and Health Sciences and the Education Council of the school<sup>6</sup> for the School of Physical Education, Health and Sport Sciences, School of Art and Design, and School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design.
- 6 If the detailed corporate regulations in Paragraph 2 are provided, amended, or repealed, it must undergo discussion at the Education Council of the School of Integrative and Global Majors.
- 7 If the detailed department regulations in Paragraph 3 are provided, amended, or repealed by the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies, the dean must undergo discussion at the Management Committee of the School of Comprehensive Studies.
- 8 If the detailed department regulations in Paragraph 1 or Paragraph 3 are provided, amended, or repealed, deans or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies must notify the president.<sup>9</sup> The provisions of the preceding 4 paragraphs shall apply to cases in the case of establishing the detailed department regulations and the detailed corporate regulations within and thereafter in Chapter 5, Article 25.

(修業年限)

第2条 学群の修業年限は、4年とする。

- 2 前項の規定にかかわらず、医学群に置かれる学校教育法（昭和22年法律第26号）第87条第2項に定める医学を履修する課程（以下「医学類」という。）にあつては、6年とする。

3 前2項の修業年限には、総合学域群において修学した期間の全部又は一部を含むものとする。

(Course term)

Article 2 The course term of the school shall be four years.

2 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 2, Article 2, Paragraph 1, the standard number of school years for graduation from the medical program (hereinafter referred to as the “College of Medicine”), established in the School of Medicine and Health Sciences, shall be 6 years, as stipulated in Article 87, Paragraph 2 of the School Education Act (Act No. 26 of 1947)<sup>7</sup>.

3 The course term in the preceding 2 paragraphs shall include in whole or in part the period of education in the School of Comprehensive Studies.

(長期履修学生の修業年限)

第2条の2 学群において、学生が職業を有している等の事情により、修業年限を超えて一定の期間にわたり計画的に教育課程を履修し課程を修了することを希望する旨を申し出たときは、法人細則で定めるところにより、その計画的な履修を認めることができる。

2 前項の規定により計画的な履修を認められた者（以下「長期履修学生」という。）に係る修業年限は、当該課程の在学年限を超えることができない。

(Course term of students who were approved the register extending)

Article 2-2 In a school, when a student wishes to take and complete the education curriculum systematically over a fixed period beyond the course term, due to circumstances such as having a job, etc. according to the detailed corporate regulations, it is possible to admit the planned study.

2 The course term of a person who is approved the register extending to take planned courses under the provisions of the preceding paragraph may not exceed the maximum enrollment duration of the corresponding course.

(修業年限の通算)

第3条 前2条の規定にかかわらず、第19条に規定する場合を除き、第24条の2に規定する特別の課程の履修により筑波大学において一定の単位を修得した者及び第69条に規定する科目等履修生として筑波大学において一定の単位を修得した者が筑波大学に入学する場合において、当該単位の修得により筑波大学の学群における教育課程の一部を履修したと認められるときは、学類教育会議、専門学群教育会議又は学位プログラム教育会議（以下「教育会議」という。）の議を経て、学群長又はグローバル教育院の教育院長（以下「グローバル教育院長」という。）（以下「学群長等」という。）が修得した単位数その他の事項を勘案して定める期間を前2条に定める修業年限に算入することができる。ただし、その期間は、同条に定める修業年限の2分の1を超えてはならない。

(Combining of the total number of the course term)

Article 3 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding 2 articles, if a person who has acquired a certain number of credits at the University of Tsukuba by completing a special curriculum provided in Article 24-2 and a person who has acquired a certain number of credits at the University of Tsukuba as a credited auditor as prescribed in Article 69 enters the University of Tsukuba, and it is deemed that the said person has completed part of the education curriculum of a school of the University of Tsukuba by means of such credits (excluding cases as set forth in Article 19), deans or the dean of the School of Integrative and Global Majors (hereinafter referred to as the “dean of SIGMA”; hereinafter referred to as “deans, etc.”) may stipulate a

certain period as applicable to the course term as stipulated in the preceding 2 articles upon deliberation with the Education Council of the college, Education Council of the school, or Degree Program Faculty Meeting (hereinafter referred to as “Education Council”). This certain period shall be decided by taking such credits and other circumstances into account and shall not exceed half of the total number of course term as stipulated in Chapter 2, Article 2.

(在学年限)

第4条 学群の在学年限は、6年とする。

2 前項の規定にかかわらず、医学類の在学年限は、9年とする。

3 総合学域群の在学年限は、2年とする。

4 前3項の規定にかかわらず、総合学域群から移行した学生の移行後の在学年限は、第1項又は第2項の年数から、総合学域群の在学期間を差し引いた期間とする。

(Maximum enrollment duration)

Article 4 The maximum enrollment duration at the school shall be six years.

2 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 2, Article 4, Paragraph 1, the maximum enrollment duration at the College of Medicine shall be nine years.

3 The maximum enrollment duration at the School of Comprehensive Studies shall be 2 years.

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding three paragraphs, the maximum enrollment duration after the transfer of the student who transferred from the School of Comprehensive Studies shall be the period obtained by deducting the attendance period in the School of Comprehensive Studies.

(教育研究活動等状況の公表)

第4条の2 筑波大学は、教育研究の成果の普及及び活用の促進に資するため、その教育研究活動等の状況を公表するものとする。

(Official report on education and research activities, etc.)

Article 4-2 The education and research activities of the University of Tsukuba shall be made public so that the University can stimulate dissemination and utilization of education and research achievements.

### 第3章 学年、学期及び休業日

#### Chapter 3 Academic Year, Semester, and Holidays

(学年)

第5条 次条に規定する春学期及び秋学期の入学者に係る学年は、それぞれ次のとおりとする。

(1) 春学期の入学者 4月1日に始まり、翌年3月31日に終わる。

(2) 秋学期の入学者 10月1日に始まり、翌年9月30日に終わる。

2 前項の規定にかかわらず、教育上必要な場合には、学長は、別に学年を定めることができる。

(Academic year)

Article 5 The academic year pertaining to the entrants of the spring semester and fall semester prescribed in the following article shall be as follows respectively.

(i) For entrants of the spring semester, the academic year shall begin on April 1 and end on March 31 of the following year.

(ii) For entrants of the fall semester, the academic year shall begin on October 1 and end on September 30 of

the following year.

2 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, when necessary from an educational standpoint, the president may prescribe the academic year separately.

(学期)

第6条 学年を次の2学期に分けるものとし、それぞれの期間は、次のとおりとする。

- (1) 春学期 4月1日から9月30日まで
- (2) 秋学期 10月1日から翌年3月31日まで

2 前項の規定にかかわらず、教育上必要な場合には、学長は、別に学期の期間を定めることができる。

(Semester)

Article 6 The academic year shall be divided into the following 2 semesters and the respective periods shall be as follows.

- (i) Spring semester from April 1 to September 30
- (ii) Fall semester from October 1 to March 31

2 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, the president may separately prescribe the period of the semester if it is necessary for educational purposes.

(休業日)

第7条 休業日は、次のとおりとする。

- (1) 日曜日
- (2) 土曜日
- (3) 国民の祝日に関する法律（昭和23年法律第178号）に規定する休日
- (4) 開学記念日 10月1日
- (5) 春季休業 2月1日から4月4日まで
- (6) 夏季休業 8月1日から9月30日まで
- (7) 冬季休業 12月27日から翌年1月6日まで

2 教育研究上必要な場合には、学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、前項の休業日を臨時に変更することができる。

3 教育研究上必要な場合には、学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、第1項に規定するもののほか、臨時の休業日を定めることができる。

4 前3項の規定にかかわらず、学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群の休業日は、法人細則で定める。

(Holidays)

Article 7 Holidays shall be as follows.

- (i) Sundays
- (ii) Saturdays
- (iii) Holidays set forth in the National Holidays Act (Act No. 178 of 1948)<sup>8</sup>
- (iv) University Foundation Day on October 1
- (v) Spring recess from February 1 to April 4
- (vi) Summer recess from August 1 to September 30

(vii) Winter recess from December 27 to January 6

- 2 If it is necessary from the viewpoint of education and research, the president may temporarily change the holidays stipulated in Chapter 3, Article 7, Paragraph 1, upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.
- 3 If it is necessary from the viewpoint of education and research, the president may decide on temporary holidays in addition to those stipulated in Chapter 3, Article 7, Paragraph 1, upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.
- 4 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding three paragraphs, holidays for the School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.

#### 第4章 入学等

#### Chapter 4 Admissions

(入学の時期)

第8条 入学の時期は、学年の始めとする。ただし、教育上支障がないときは、法人細則で定めるところにより、学期の始めとすることができる。

(Time of admission)

Article 8 The time of admission shall be at the beginning of the academic year. Provided that there are no obstacles from an educational point of view, the time of admission may be at the beginning of each semester as stipulated in the detailed corporate regulations.

(入学資格)

第9条 筑波大学に入学できる者は、次の各号のいずれかに該当するものとする。

- (1) 高等学校を卒業した者
- (2) 中等教育学校を卒業した者
- (3) 通常の課程による12年の学校教育を修了した者
- (4) 外国において、学校教育における12年の課程を修了した者又はこれに準ずる者で文部科学大臣の指定したもの
- (5) 文部科学大臣が高等学校の課程と同等の課程を有するものとして認定した在外教育施設の当該課程を修了した者
- (6) 学校教育法施行規則（昭和22年文部省令第11号）第150条第3号の規定により、文部科学大臣が別に指定する専修学校の高等課程（修業年限が3年以上であることその他の文部科学大臣が定める基準を満たすものに限る。）を文部科学大臣が定める日以後に修了した者
- (7) 学校教育法施行規則第150条第4号の規定により、高等学校を卒業した者と同等以上の学力があると認められた者として文部科学大臣が指定した者
- (8) 高等学校卒業程度認定試験規則（平成17年文部科学省令第1号）による高等学校卒業程度認定試験に合格した者（同規則附則第2条の規定による廃止前の大学入学資格検定規程（昭和26年文部省令第13号）による大学入学資格検定に合格した者を含む。）
- (9) 筑波大学において、個別の入学資格審査により、高等学校を卒業した者と同等以上の学力があると認めた者で、18歳に達したもの

(Entrance qualification)

Article 9 Persons falling under any of the following items are eligible to apply for entry to the University of Tsukuba.

- (i) Persons who have graduated from a senior high school
- (ii) Persons who have graduated from a secondary education school

- (iii) Persons who have completed a 12-year course of school education with a regular curriculum
- (iv) Persons who have completed a 12-year course of school education with a regular curriculum in a foreign country or persons in similar situations as recognized by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology
- (v) Persons who have completed an appropriate course at an educational institution based in a foreign country that has been recognized by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as adhering to a curriculum equivalent to that of a senior high school
- (vi) Persons who have completed an upper secondary course in a specialized training college (limited to those which meet the standards prescribed by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, including those which have a course term of 3 years or more) separately designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in accordance with the provisions of Item (iii) of Article 150 of the Regulation for Enforcement of the School Education Act<sup>9</sup> (Order of the Ministry of Education No.11 of 1947) on or after a day decided by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology
- (vii) Persons who have been designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as possessing an equivalent or higher scholastic ability compared to that of a senior high school graduate in accordance with the provisions of Item (iv) of Article 150 of the Regulation for Enforcement of the School Education Act (Order of the Ministry of Education No.11 of 1947)
- (viii) Persons who have passed a certificate course for students achieving the Upper Secondary School Equivalency Examination under the Regulation for Upper Secondary School Equivalency Examination<sup>10</sup> (Order of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology No. 1 of 2005). (This also includes persons who have passed the University Entrance Qualification Examination under the former Regulation for the University Entrance Qualification Examination<sup>11</sup> (Order of the Ministry of Education No. 13 of 1951) in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of the Supplementary Provisions contained in such Regulation.)
- (ix) Persons who have been recognized by the University of Tsukuba as possessing an equivalent or higher scholastic ability compared to that of a senior high school graduate through an individual entrance qualification examination and who have reached the age of 18

(入学者選抜に関する基本方針等)

第10条 学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、入学者選抜に関する基本方針を定める。

2 学長は、毎年度、前項で定めた基本方針に基づき、入学者選抜の実施方法の概要を告示する。

(Basic policy for the selection of entrants, etc.)

Article 10 The president shall determine the basic policy for the selection of entrants upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

2 In accordance with the basic policy as set out in Chapter 4, Article 10, Paragraph 1, the president shall give a notice of the outline of the implementation method of the selection of entrants each academic year.

(入学の出願)

第 1 1 条 筑波大学への入学を志願する者（次項において「入学志願者」という。）は、入学願書に法人細則で定める書類を添えて、願出しなければならない。

2 入学志願者は、前項の出願に当たっては、別表第 1 に定める額の検定料を納付しなければならない。ただし、学長が特に定める場合は、この限りでない。

(Admission application)

Article 11 Applicants for admission to the University of Tsukuba (referred to as “applicants for admission” in Chapter 4, Article 11, Paragraph 2) shall file an application form together with the documents prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.

2 Upon filing an application as noted in Chapter 4, Article 11, Paragraph 1, applicants for admission shall pay the examination fee prescribed in Appended Table 1. Provided however, that this does not apply where specially prescribed by the president.

(入学者選抜)

第 1 2 条 前条の出願をした者について、法人細則で定めるところにより、入学者選抜を行う。

2 入学者選抜の種類は、一般選抜、学校推薦型選抜、総合型選抜及びグローバル選抜とする。

3 入学者選抜の方法は、書類審査、学力試験、小論文、面接又は実技試験によるものとする。

(Selection of entrants)

Article 12 The selection of entrants shall be carried out for a person filing an application as noted in Chapter 4, Article 11, in accordance with the provisions of the detailed corporate regulations.

2 The types of the selection of entrants shall be the individual achievement test, selection by school recommendation, comprehensive selection, and global selection.

3 The methods used for the selection of entrants shall consist of the screening of documents, scholastic ability examinations, short essays, interviews, or practical examinations.

(法人細則への委任)

第 1 3 条 第 8 条から前条まで及び次条第 1 項に規定するもののほか、入学者選抜等に関し必要な事項は、法人細則で定める。

(Delegation to the detailed corporate regulations)

Article 13 In addition to the provisions included in Chapter 4, Articles 8 through 12 and in Chapter 4, Article 14, Paragraph 1, any necessary matters pertaining to the selection of entrants shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.

(特別な組織)

第 1 4 条 第 1 0 条各項に規定する入学者選抜に関する基本方針及び入学者選抜の実施方法の概要に基づき入学者選抜を円滑に行い、第 2 3 条第 3 項に規定する学群の教育課程の編成方針に基づき適切な教育課程を編成し、並びに第 5 6 条第 2 項に規定する学生の円滑な修学及び学生生活の支援並びに指導助言に関する基本方針に基づき必要な措置及び指導助言を効果的に行うため、国立大学法人筑波大学の組織及び運営の基本に関する規則（平成 1 6 年法人規則第 1 号）第 3 5 条第 1 項に規定する特別な組織を置くものとする。

2 前項の特別な組織の組織及び運営については、法人規程で定める。

(Special organization)

Article 14 In order to facilitate the selection of entrants based on the basic policy for the selection of entrants

stipulated in each paragraph of Article 10 and the outline of the implementation method of the selection of entrants, a special organization as prescribed in Article 35, Paragraph 1 of the Regulations Concerning the Basis of Organization and Operation of the National University Corporation University of Tsukuba (Corporate Regulations No. 1 of 2004) shall be established. Additional purposes of this special organization include designing appropriate education curriculum in accordance with the education curriculum design policy of the schools as set out in Chapter 5, Article 23, Paragraph 3, and taking the necessary measures pertaining to and giving effective guidance and advice in accordance with the basic policy for facilitating education for the students, support for their daily activities, and guidance for their studies as set out in Chapter 10, Article 56, Paragraph 2.

2 The establishment and operations of the special organization as noted in Chapter 4, Article 14, Paragraph 1 shall be as determined in the corporate rules<sup>12</sup>.

(入学手続及び入学許可)

第15条 入学者選抜の結果に基づき合格の通知を受けた者であつて筑波大学への入学を希望するものは、所定の期日までに法人細則で定める書類を提出するとともに、別表第1に定める額の入学料を納付しなければならない。ただし、入学料の納付について学長が特に定める場合は、この限りでない。

2 学長は、前項の入学手続を完了した者（次条に規定する入学料の免除又は第17条に規定する入学料の徴収猶予を申請している者を含む。）に入学を許可する。

3 納付された入学料は、返付しない。ただし、次条の規定により入学料を免除された場合には、免除の額に相当する額を返付することができる。

(Admission procedures and matriculation)

Article 15 A person who receives notification of passing based on the result of the selection of entrants and desires to enter the University of Tsukuba shall submit all documents prescribed by the detailed corporate regulations as well as pay the admission fee as prescribed in Appended Table 1 on or before the predetermined date, except in cases where the admission fee payment has been otherwise determined by the president.

2 The president shall admit a person who has completed the admission procedures as set out in Chapter 4, Article 15, Paragraph 1 to the University of Tsukuba (including those persons who have applied for admission fee exemption as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 16 or those persons who have applied for admission fee deferment as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 17).

3 There will be no refund of the admission fee. However, in the case where a person is deemed exempt from the admission fee in accordance with Chapter 4, Article 16, an amount corresponding to such exemption may be refunded to the person.

(入学料の免除)

第16条 学長は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する場合には、入学料の全部又は一部を免除することができる。

(1) 大学等における修学の支援に関する法律（令和元年法律第8号）第8条第1項に規定する要件に該当する場合

(2) 大学等における修学の支援に関する法律施行規則（令和元年文部科学省令第6号）第9条第3項に該当しない者（第44条において「施行規則第9条第3項非該当者」という。）であつて、入学前1年以内において、当該者の学資を主として負担している者（以下「学資負担者」という。）が死亡し、又は当該者若しくは学資負担者が風水害等の災害を受け、入学料の納付

- が著しく困難であると認められる場合
- (3) その他学長が相当と認める事由があるものとして法人規程で定めるものに該当する場合

(Admission fee exemption)

Article 16 The president may grant all or part of an admission fee exemption in any of the following items.

- (i) When the requirements prescribed in Paragraph 1, Article 8 of the Act on Support in Education at Universities, Etc. (Act No. 8 of 2019) are met
- (ii) When a person who does not fall under Paragraph 3, Article 9 of the Ordinance for Enforcement of the Act on Support in Education at Universities, Etc. (Order of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology No. 6 of 2019; to be referred to as "person not applicable to Paragraph 3, Article 9 of the Ordinance for Enforcement" in Article 44) and who mainly pays school expenses of the said person (to be referred to as the "person paying the school expenses") has died or the said person or person paying the school expenses has been affected by disaster including wind or flood damage within a period of one year prior to admission and payment of admission fee is found extremely difficult.
- (iii) In the case where the president considers it otherwise reasonable that the student falls under the provisions of the corporate rules

(入学料の徴収猶予)

第17条 学長は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する場合には、入学料の徴収を猶予することができる。

- (1) 経済的理由によって納付期限までに納付が困難であり、かつ、学業優秀と認められる場合
- (2) 入学前1年以内において、学資負担者が死亡し、又は入学する者若しくは学資負担者が風水害等の災害を受け、納付期限までに納付が困難であると認められる場合
- (3) その他学長が相当と認める事由があるものとして法人規程で定めるものに該当する場合

(Admission fee deferment)

Article 17 The president may grant admission fee deferment in any of the following items.

- (i) In the case where it is difficult for a student, who is deemed to be an excellent prospect, to pay on or before the due date for economic reasons
- (ii) In the case where the school expense payer passes away or if the person who has been admitted to the University of Tsukuba or the school expense payer suffers a disaster situation, such as storm and flood damage, within one year prior to the person being admitted to the University and it is considered extremely difficult to pay on or before the due date
- (iii) In the case where the president considers it otherwise reasonable that the student falls under the provisions of the corporate rules

(法人規程への委任)

第18条 前2条に規定するもののほか、入学料の免除及び徴収猶予に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Delegation to the corporate rules)

Article 18 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 4, Articles 16 and 17, any necessary matters relating to admission fee exemption or admission fee deferment shall be as prescribed in the corporate rules

(国費外国人留学生等の入学の特例)

第18条の2 第11条から第13条まで及び第15条から前条までの規定にかかわらず、国費外国人留学生制度実施要項（昭和29年3月31日文科大臣裁定）に基づく国費外国人留学生及び日韓共同理工系学部留学生事業実施要項（平成12年8月1日文部省学術国際局長裁定）に基づく日韓共同理工系学部留学生（以下「国費外国人留学生等」という。）の入学については、別に定める。

(Special provisions on admission of Japanese Government (Monbukagakusho) Scholarship Students, etc.)  
Article 18-2 Notwithstanding the provisions included in Chapter 4, Articles 11 to 13 and Chapter 4, Articles 15 to 18, admission of a Japanese Government Scholarship student to the University of Tsukuba under the Japanese Government Scholarship Student System Implementation Guidelines (ruling by the Minister of Education, Science, Sports and Culture dated March 31, 1954)<sup>13</sup> and a Japan-Korea Government Scientific Scholarship student to the University of Tsukuba under the Japan-Korea Government Scientific Scholarship Student Project Implementation Guidelines (ruling by the Director of the Academic and International Bureau of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology dated August 1, 2000)<sup>14</sup> (hereinafter referred to as “Japanese Government Scholarship students”) shall be as determined separately.

(編入学、転入学及び再入学)

第19条 次の各号のいずれかに該当する者が編入学（医学群に置かれる学類への編入学を除く。）を志願したときは、選考の上、相当年次に編入学を許可することができる。

- (1) 大学（短期大学を除く。以下この号及び第3項において同じ。）を卒業した者又は大学に2年以上在学し、62単位以上修得し退学した者
  - (2) 短期大学、高等専門学校、旧国立工業教員養成所又は旧国立養護教諭養成所を卒業した者
  - (3) 外国の大学又は短期大学を卒業した者
  - (4) 学校教育法第58条の2又は第132条の規定に該当する者
  - (5) 学校教育法施行規則附則第7条の規定に該当する者
- 2 医学群に置かれる学類への編入学については、法人規程で定める。
- 3 他の大学（外国の大学を含む。）に現に2年以上在学し、62単位以上修得している者が転入学を志願したときは、選考の上、相当年次に転入学を許可することができる。
- 4 筑波大学を卒業した者又は退学した者のうち筑波大学に1年以上在学したものが再入学を志願したときは、選考の上、相当年次に再入学を許可することができる。ただし、退学した者にあつては、希望する再入学日が退学の日の翌日から起算して2年を経過していない場合であつて、退学時に所属していた学群、学類又は総合学域群（ただし、退学時に移行する学群又は学類が決定していた者にあつては当該学群又は学類とする。）に再入学を希望するときその他法人規則等で定める要件に該当するときに限る。
- 5 前各項に規定する編入学、転入学及び再入学に係る入学手続及び入学許可については、第15条の規定を準用する。
- 6 第1項から第4項までに規定する編入学、転入学及び再入学に係る第16条に規定する入学料の免除及び第17条に規定する入学料の徴収猶予については、第15条第1項の入学者選抜の結果に基づき合格の通知を受けた者であつて筑波大学への入学を希望するものの例による。

(Transfer admission, transfer, and re-enrollment)

Article 19 If a person in any of the following items applies for transfer admission to the University of Tsukuba (excluding transfer admission to a college within the School of Medicine and Health Sciences), such person may be allowed to transfer to the corresponding academic year after screening procedures have been undertaken.

- (i) A person who has graduated from a university (excluding junior colleges; hereinafter the same shall apply to this item and Chapter 4, Article 19, Paragraph 3) or who has attended a university for at least two years and has acquired at least 62 credits but has withdrawn from such previously attended university
- (ii) A person who has graduated from a junior college, a college of technology, a former national training institute for technical teachers, or a former national training institute for nursing instructors
- (iii) A person who has graduated from a foreign university or junior college
- (iv) A person falling under the provisions of Article 58-2<sup>15</sup> or Article 132 of the School Education Act<sup>16</sup>.
- (v) A person falling under the provisions of Article 7 of the Supplementary Provisions of the Regulation for Enforcement of the School Education Act<sup>17</sup>.

2 Transfer admission to any college in the School of Medicine and Health Sciences shall be as prescribed in the corporate rules.

3 If a person who has attended another university (including a foreign university) for at least two years and has acquired at least 62 credits desires to transfer to the University of Tsukuba, such person may be allowed to transfer to the corresponding academic year after screening procedures have been undertaken.

4 If a person who has graduated or withdrawn from the University of Tsukuba and had previously attended the University for at least one year desires to re-enroll in the university, such person shall be allowed to re-enroll in the corresponding academic year of the University after screening; provided however, that for those who have withdrawn, re-enrollment is only permitted if the desired re-enrollment date is within two years from the day following the date of withdrawal, and if they wish to re-enroll in the same school, college, or School of Comprehensive Studies they belonged to at the time of withdrawal (or the school or college they were scheduled to transfer to at the time of withdrawal), and if they meet other requirements specified by corporate regulations.

5 The provisions of Chapter 4, Article 15 shall apply to admission procedures and matriculation to the University with regard to transfer admission, transfer, and re-enrollment as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 19, Paragraphs 1 through 4 inclusive.

6 The admission fee exemption as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 16 and the deferment of admission fee as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 17 relating to transfer admission, transfer, and re-enrollment as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 19, Paragraphs 1 to 4 inclusive shall be in accordance with the case of a person who receives notification of passing based on the result of the selection of entrants and who wishes to enter the University of Tsukuba as noted in Chapter 4, Article 15, Paragraph 1.

(学群又は学類間の移籍)

第20条 学生が現に所属する学群又は学類以外の学群又は学類に移籍を志願した場合は、選考の上、現に所属する学群又は学類及び移籍を志願する学群又は学類の学群長の許可を得て、当該学群又は学類の相当年次に移籍することができる。

(Transfer between school or colleges)

Article 20 If a student wishes to transfer from the school or college in which (s)he is currently registered to another school or college, the student may transfer into the corresponding academic year of the new school

or college after screening and after obtaining permission from the dean in which the said student is currently registered and the dean to which the student wishes to transfer.

(学類又は芸術専門学群への移行)

第21条 総合学域群の学生であって、移行する学群（体育専門学群及び学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群を除く。）が決定したものは、当該学群の学群長の許可を得て、学類又は芸術専門学群に移行するものとする。

2 前項に定めるもののほか、総合学域群の学生の学類又は芸術専門学群への移行に関し必要な事項は、法人細則で定める。

(Transfer to a college or the School of Art and Design)

Article 21 A student of the School of Comprehensive Studies who decided the school to transfer (excluding the School of Physical Education, Health and Sport Sciences and School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design) shall transfer to a college or the School of Art and Design with the permission of the dean of the school.

2 In addition to what is provided for in the preceding paragraph, necessary matters concerning the transfer to the college of the student of the School of Comprehensive Studies or School of Art and Design shall be stipulated in the detailed corporate regulations.

(編入学者等の既に履修した授業科目等の取扱い)

第22条 第19条の規定により入学を許可された学生及び第20条の規定により移籍を許可された学生の既に履修した授業科目及び修得した単位数の取扱い並びに在学すべき年数及び在学年限については、教育会議の議を経て、学群長が決定する。

(Handling of class subjects, etc. already taken by the transfer student, etc.)

Article 22 The dean, upon deliberation with the Education Council, shall decide the handling of class subjects already taken and number of units of a student permitted to enroll under the provisions of Chapter 4, Article 19 and students permitted to transfer under the provisions of the Chapter 4, Article 20, as well as the number of years for which persons must be enrolled and their maximum enrollment duration.

## 第5章 教育課程、履修方法等

### Chapter 5 Education Curriculum and Course Registration

(教育課程の編成方針)

第23条 教育課程は、筑波大学及び学群、学類、グローバル教育院又は学位プログラム（以下「学群等」という。）の教育上の目的を達成するために必要な授業科目を開設して、体系的に編成しなければならない。

2 教育課程の編成に当たっては、学群等の専攻に係る専門の学芸を教授するとともに、幅広く深い教養及び総合的な判断力を培い、豊かな人間性を涵養するよう配慮するものとする。

3 学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、学群の教育課程の編成方針を定めるものとする。

(Policy to organize the education curriculum)

Article 23 The education curriculum must be systematically organized by establishing the class subjects necessary to achieve the educational purpose of the University of Tsukuba, schools, colleges, the School of Integrative and Global Majors, or degree programs (hereinafter referred to as “schools, etc.”).

2 In designing the education curriculum, due attention shall be paid to teaching the specialty of the schools, etc.

in terms of professionally oriented arts and sciences, cultivating broadly enhanced education and comprehensive judgment, as well as fostering an enriched sense of humanity.

3 The president shall determine the policy to organize the education curriculum of the school upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(教育課程の編成方法等)

第24条 教育課程は、各授業科目を必修科目、選択科目及び自由科目に分け、これを各年次に配当して編成するものとする。

2 授業科目の区分は、専門科目、専門基礎科目並びに共通科目及び関連科目からなる基礎科目とし、学群等が当該年度ごとに開設する授業科目の名称、単位数及び履修方法等については、別に定める。

3 授業は、講義、演習、実験、実習若しくは実技又はこれらの併用による多様な方法により実施するものとする。

4 授業は、教育会議の議を経て、多様なメディアを高度に利用して、当該授業を行う教室等以外の場所で実施することができる。

5 授業は、外国において履修させることができる。前項の規定により、多様なメディアを高度に利用して、当該授業を行う教室等以外の場所で履修させる場合についても同様とする。

6 授業の一部を、筑波大学の校舎及び附属施設以外の場所で行うことができる。

(How to organize the education curriculum)

Article 24 The education curriculum shall be organized by dividing all class subjects into categories of compulsory subjects, elective subjects, and free elective subjects, and appropriating these to each school year.

2 The classification of class subjects shall be major subjects, as well as foundation subjects for the major, general foundation subjects consisting of common foundation subjects, specific foundation subjects. The names, the number of credits and the course registration for each class subject set up by each school each academic year shall be separately prescribed.

3 Classes shall be conducted through various methods such as lectures, seminars, experiments, practical trainings, or skills practices, or a combination thereof.

4 Classes may be conducted at locations other than the classroom where such classes are conducted by fully utilizing various media channels upon deliberation with the Education Council.

5 Classes may be conducted abroad. The same shall apply to cases where classes are conducted at locations other than the scheduled classroom by fully utilizing various media channels in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 24, Paragraph 4.

6 Certain classes may be conducted at locations other than university buildings and affiliated facilities of the University of Tsukuba.

(特別の課程の編成)

第24条の2 学長は、必要があると認めるときは、学校教育法第105条の規定に基づく筑波大学の学生以外の者を対象とした特別の課程（次項において「特別の課程」という。）を編成するものとする。

2 前項に定めるもののほか、特別の課程の編成に関し必要な事項は、別に法人規則で定める。

(Organization of a special curriculum)

Article 24-2 If the president deems it necessary, (s)he shall organize a special curriculum (hereinafter referred to in Chapter 5, Article 24-2, Paragraph 2 as “special curriculum”) aimed at people other than the students of

the University of Tsukuba, in accordance with the provisions of Article 105 of the School Education Act<sup>18</sup>.

2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 24-2, Paragraph 1, necessary matters concerning the organization of a special curriculum shall be prescribed separately by the corporate regulations.

(主専攻分野)

第25条 学群長及びグローバル教育院長は、学生が重点的に履修すべき授業科目の範囲を定めた主専攻分野を置く。

2 前項の主専攻分野は、部局細則（学位プログラムにあっては法人細則。以下同じ。）で定めるものとする。

(Major fields)

Article 25 Deans and the dean of SIGMA shall establish the scope of the class subjects that students should predominantly study as their major fields.

2 The major fields as stipulated in Chapter 5, Article 25, Paragraph 1 shall be prescribed in the detailed department regulations (in case of the Degree Programs, the detailed corporate regulations; the same applies hereinafter.).

(主専攻及び副専攻)

第25条の2 学生は、前条第1項の主専攻分野のうちから、入学した年次の終了時以降に主専攻を選択するものとする。ただし、入学した年次において主専攻が決定している者にあつてはこの限りでない。

2 主専攻の決定は、部局細則で定めるところにより、学群長及びグローバル教育院長が行う。

3 学群長及びグローバル教育院長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、部局細則で定めるところにより、学群等の他の主専攻分野の一つを副専攻として学生に履修させることができる。

(Major and minor)

Article 25-2 Students shall choose a major after the end of the year of admission from among major fields set forth in Paragraph 1 of the preceding Article; provided however, that this shall not apply to students who has decided their major in the year of admission.

2 The decision as to the major shall be undertaken by deans and the dean of SIGMA in accordance with the provisions of the detailed department regulations.

3 If deans and the dean of SIGMA deem it instructive from an educational point of view, the dean may order a student registered in his/her school to study another major field as a minor in accordance with the detailed department regulations.

(教育職員の免許等に関する授業科目等)

第26条 筑波大学は、第24条の授業科目に加えて、次に掲げる授業科目を開設するものとする。

(1) 教育職員免許法（昭和24年法律第147号）に定める教員の免許状で、別に示す種類及び教科の免許状の取得に必要な授業科目

(2) 社会教育法（昭和24年法律第207号）に定める社会教育主事の資格の取得に必要な授業科目

(3) 図書館法（昭和25年法律第118号）に定める司書の資格の取得に必要な授業科目

(4) 博物館法（昭和26年法律第285号）に定める学芸員の資格の取得に必要な授業科目

(5) 学校図書館法（昭和28年法律第185号）に定める司書教諭の資格の取得に必要な授業科目

## 目

2 前項の授業科目及びその履修方法については、別に定める。

(Class subject, etc. concerning teacher's license, etc.)

Article 26 In addition to the class subjects noted in Chapter 5, Article 24, the class subjects prescribed in each of the following items shall be established by the University of Tsukuba.

(i) Class subjects that are necessary to obtain various types of teacher's licenses for academic subjects as well as teacher's licenses, as prescribed in the Education Personnel License Act (Act No. 147 of 1949)<sup>19</sup>.

(ii) Class subjects that are necessary to obtain a social education supervisor's certificate, as prescribed in the Social Education Act (Act No. 207 of 1949)<sup>20</sup>.

(iii) Class subjects that are necessary to obtain a librarian's certificate, as prescribed in the Library Act (Act No. 118 of 1950)<sup>21</sup>.

(iv) Class subjects that are necessary to obtain a curator's certificate, as prescribed in the Museum Act (Act No. 285 of 1951)<sup>22</sup>.

(v) Class subjects that are necessary to obtain a librarian-teacher's certificate, as prescribed in the School Library Act (Act No. 185 of 1953)<sup>23</sup>.

2 Class subjects noted in Chapter 5, Article 26, Paragraph 1 and the course registration thereof shall be decided separately.

## 第27条 削除

### Article 27 Deleted

(部局細則への委任)

第28条 この法人規則及びこれに基づく法人規程又は法人細則等に定めるもののほか、教育課程の編成及びその履修に必要な事項は、部局細則で定める。

(Delegation to the detailed department regulations)

Article 28 In addition to the provisions of these Corporate Regulations, and the corporate rules or the detailed corporate regulations which have been based on these Corporate Regulations, any necessary matters related to education curriculum design and registration shall be prescribed in the detailed department regulations.

(教育内容等の改善のための組織的な研修等)

第28条の2 学群は、それぞれの教育課程における授業の内容及び方法の改善を図るための組織的な研修及び研究を実施しなければならない。

2 総合学域群は、修学支援及び学生生活支援の内容及び方法の改善を図るための組織的な研修及び研究を実施しなければならない。

3 学群及び総合学域群は、前2項の実施結果について、毎年度、教育を担当する副学長に報告しなければならない。

(Organized training, etc. for improving educational contents, etc.)

Article 28-2 Schools must implement organized training and research to improve the content and method of classes in the respective education curriculum.

2 The School of Comprehensive Studies must implement organized training and research to improve the content and method of education support and student life support.

3 Schools and the School of Comprehensive Studies must report the results of the implementation in the preceding 2 paragraphs to the vice president for education each academic year.

(社会的及び職業的自立を図るために必要な能力を培うための体制)

第28条の3 筑波大学は、筑波大学及び学群等又は総合学域群の教育上の目的に応じ、学生が卒業後自らの能力を発揮し、社会的及び職業的自立を図るために必要な能力を、教育課程の実施、厚生補導等を通じて培うことができるよう、大学内の組織間の有機的な連携を図り、適切な体制を整えるものとする。

(Structures to cultivate abilities necessary for achieving social and professional independence)

Article 28-3 In accordance with the educational purpose of the University of Tsukuba and its schools and the School of Comprehensive Studies, the University shall establish organically inter-organizational linkages and appropriate structures with the education curriculum, as well as providing welfare and guidance that are necessary for the students to show their potential and to cultivate abilities necessary for achieving social and professional independence after graduation.

(成績評価基準等の明示等)

第28条の4 学群長及びグローバル教育院長は、学生に対して、授業科目の方法及び内容並びに1年間の授業の計画をあらかじめ明示するものとする。

2 学群長及びグローバル教育院長は、学修の成果に係る評価及び卒業の認定に当たっては、客観性及び厳格性を確保するため、学生に対してその基準をあらかじめ明示するとともに、当該基準に従って適切に行うものとする。

(Clarification, etc. of assessment standards of academic achievement, etc.)

Article 28-4 Deans and the dean of SIGMA shall clarify in advance the methodology used to give class subjects, the contents of class subjects, and a class schedule for the year to its students.

2 Deans and the dean of SIGMA shall, when assessing its students' academic achievement and approving their graduation, clarify the standards to students in advance in order to maintain objectivity and rigorousness, and shall appropriately conduct an assessment in accordance with such standards.

(単位の授与に関する基本方針)

第29条 学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、授業科目の単位の授与等に関する基本方針を定めるものとする。

(Basic policy for granting credits)

Article 29 The president shall determine the basic policy for granting credits of class subjects upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(単位の計算方法)

第30条 授業科目の単位の計算方法は、1単位の授業科目を45時間の学修を必要とする内容を

もって構成することを標準とし、第24条第3項に規定する授業の方法に応じ、当該授業による教育効果、授業時間外に必要な学修等を考慮して、おおむね15時間から45時間までの範囲で別表第2に定める時間の授業をもって1単位として単位数を計算するものとする。ただし、芸術等の分野における個人指導による実技の授業については、部局細則で定める時間の授業をもって1単位とすることができる。

(Calculation of credits)

Article 30 For the calculation credits for class subjects, a class subject for one credit shall normally be organized to contain contents that require 45-hour learning and the number of credits is calculated as one credit consisting of classes conducted for a number of hours determined by Attached Table 2 between 15 hours and 45 hours, in light of the educational effects of the relevant class and required learning other than that during class hours, in accordance with the class method prescribed in Paragraph 3 of Article 24; provided however, that regarding skills practice classes tutoring in the artistic fields, one credit may consist of classes conducted for a number of hours determined by the detailed department regulations.

(卒業論文、卒業研究等の授業科目の単位の取扱い)

第31条 前条の規定にかかわらず、卒業論文、卒業研究等の授業科目については、学群長及びグローバル教育院長がこれらに必要な学修等を考慮して、部局細則で適当な数の単位を定めることができる。

(Handling of credit for class subjects including graduation thesis and graduation research)

Article 31 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 30, the suitable number of credits earned for class subjects such as the graduation thesis and graduation research may be decided by deans and the dean of SIGMA in the detailed department regulations by taking into account the necessary study thereof.

(履修に関する基本方針等)

第32条 学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、学生が各年次にわたって適切に授業科目を履修するための履修に関する基本方針を定める。

2 学長は、毎年度、前項の基本方針に基づく履修に関する統一的な取扱いを告示する。

(Basic policy for course registration)

Article 32 The president shall determine the basic policy for course registration upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council in order that students can complete the appropriate class subjects each year.

2 The president shall announce the unified handling of course registration based on the basic policy noted in Chapter 5, Article 32, Paragraph 1, each academic year.

(履修科目の登録の上限)

第33条 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、学生が各年次にわたって適切に授業科目を履修するため、卒業の要件として学生が修得すべき単位数について、学生が1年間又は1学期に履修科目として登録することができる単位数の上限を部局細則で定めるものとする。

2 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、部局細則で定めるところにより、所定の単位を優れた成績をもって修得した学生については、前項に定める上限を超えて履修科目の登録を認めることができる。

(Upper limit for registration for subjects to take)

Article 33 With regard to the number of credits to be acquired by a student as graduation requirements, deans,

the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies shall decide in the detailed department regulations an upper limit for the number of credits for which its students can register for a year or for a semester, so that they should take class subjects appropriately for each school year.

- 2 With regard to a student who has acquired all the predetermined credits, with excellent results, as specified by the detailed department regulations, deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may admit his/her registration for class subjects over the upper limit prescribed in the preceding paragraph.

(単位の授与)

第34条 授業科目を履修した者には、試験その他の適切な方法（以下「試験等」という。）により学修の成果を評価して所定の単位を授与する。

(Granting of credits)

Article 34 A student who has studied a class subject is granted a predetermined credits by assessing the student's academic achievement through an examination or other appropriate methods (hereinafter referred to as "examination, etc.").

(成績の評価)

第35条 授業科目の成績は、次の各号のいずれかの評語を用いるものとする。

(i) A+, A, B, C又はD

(ii) P又はF

2 前項の評語のうち、A+, A, B及びC並びにPを合格とし、D及びFを不合格とする。

3 第1項第2号に定める評語を用いて評価する授業科目については、部局細則で定めるものとする。ただし、学群を横断する授業科目については、教育上の必要性に応じ、教育を担当する副学長が別に定めることができる。

4 第1項に定める評語の評価基準は、別に定める。

(Grading method)

Article 35 The results for class subjects shall be evaluated by the letter grades listed in the following items.

(i) A+, A, B, C or D

(ii) P or F

2 Among the letter grades as noted in the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 35, Paragraph 1, A+, A, B, C, and P shall indicate pass grades, and D and F shall indicate fail grades.

3 Regarding class subjects, in the case of evaluating academic achievements by the letter grades as stipulated in the provisions of Article 35, Paragraph 1, Item (ii), it shall be prescribed in the detailed department regulations; provided however, that the vice president for education may separately set the class subject that crosses schools depending on educational needs.

4 The assessment standards of the letter grades as noted in the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 35, Paragraph 1 shall be as determined separately.

(他大学等における授業科目の履修等の取扱い)

第36条 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、他の大学又は短期大学（以下「他大学等」という。）との協議に基づき、他大学等の授業科目の履修を許可した学生が当該他大学等において修得した単位を、法人細則で定めるところにより、筑波大学における授業科目の履修により修得したものとみなす。

2 前項の規定は、外国の大学又は短期大学（以下「外国の大学等」という。）が行う通信教育によ

る授業科目を我が国において履修する場合について準用する。

- 3 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、学生が行う短期大学又は高等専門学校の専攻科における学修その他法人細則で定める学修を、教育会議又は総合学域群運営委員会の議を経て、筑波大学における授業科目の履修とみなし、単位を授与することができる。
- 4 学群長及びグローバル教育院長は、前3項の規定により修得したものとみなし、又は授与した単位について、教育会議の議を経て、合わせて60単位を限度として、卒業の要件となる単位として認めることができる。

(Handling of class subjects completed at other universities, etc.)

Article 36 In the case wherein a student who has been allowed to study class subjects at another university or junior college (hereinafter referred to as “other universities”) in accordance with consultations with other universities, and who has completed such class subjects, deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies shall consider these subject-area classes to have been completed by the student at the University of Tsukuba, in accordance with the provisions of the detailed corporate regulations, when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint.

- 2 The provisions of Chapter 5, Article 36, Paragraph 1 shall apply to cases where a student studies class subjects established by a foreign university or junior college (hereinafter referred to as “foreign universities”) in Japan through a distance learning program.
- 3 Deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may consider studies completed by a student at a junior college or a diploma course of a college of technology or other studies as prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations as completed class subjects at the University of Tsukuba and may grant credits to such a student upon deliberation with the Education Council or steering committee of the School of Comprehensive Studies, when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint.
- 4 Upon deliberation with the Education Council, deans and the dean of SIGMA may approve up to 60 credits that are considered to have been completed by a student or that have been granted to a student in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 36, Paragraphs 1 through 3 inclusive as credits earned towards the graduation requirements.

(休学期間中の外国の大学等の修得単位の取扱い)

- 第36条の2 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、学生が休学期間中に外国の大学等において修得した単位について、筑波大学において修得したものとみなし、認定することができる。
- 2 前項の規定により筑波大学において修得したものとみなすことのできる単位は、前条第4項の規定を準用する。

(Handling of earned credits in universities, etc. overseas for the period of leave of absence)

Article 36-2 Deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may consider credits granted by foreign universities during a period of leave of absence of students as completed subject-area classes at the University of Tsukuba and may grant credits, when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint.

- 2 The provisions of Chapter 5, Article 36, Paragraph 4 shall apply to credits granted for subject-area classes that are considered to have been completed at the University of Tsukuba, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Article 36-2, Paragraph 1.

(入学前の既修得単位等の取扱い)

- 第37条 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、学生が

入学前に筑波大学又は他大学等において修得した単位その他法人細則で定める単位を、教育会議又は総合学域群運営委員会の議を経て、入学後の筑波大学における授業科目の履修により修得したものとみなすことができる。

- 2 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、学生が入学前に行った第36条第3項に規定する学修を、教育会議又は総合学域群運営委員会の議を経て、入学後の筑波大学における授業科目の履修とみなし、単位を授与することができる。
- 3 前2項の規定により修得したものとみなし、又は授与することができる単位については、第19条に規定する編入学等の場合を除き、筑波大学において修得した単位以外のものについて、第36条第1項から第3項まで及び前条第2項並びに第51条第5項の規定により筑波大学における授業科目の履修により修得したものとみなす単位数と合わせて60単位を超えないものとする。

(Handling of credits acquired prior to admission)

Article 37 Deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may, when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint, deem credits that its student has acquired by completing class subjects at the University of Tsukuba, other universities, etc. prior to being admitted and other credits pursuant to the provisions of the detailed corporate regulations to be credits that they have acquired by completing class subjects at the University of Tsukuba after being admitted after discussion by the Education Council or steering committee of the School of Comprehensive Studies,2 Deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may consider studies completed by a student before the said student enters the University of Tsukuba as prescribed in Chapter 5, Article 36, Paragraph 3 as the completion of class subjects at the University of Tsukuba after the student enters, when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint.

- 3 Credits that may be deemed to have been earned or awarded pursuant to the provisions of the preceding two paragraphs shall not exceed 60 credits, including the number of credits deemed to have been earned through the completion of class subjects at the University of Tsukuba pursuant to the provisions of Article 36, Paragraphs 1 to 3, Paragraph 2 of the preceding Article, and Article 51, Paragraph 5 for credits other than those earned at the University of Tsukuba except in the case of transfer admission, etc. as stipulated in Article 19.

(履修関係資料の提供)

第38条 筑波大学は、学生が自己の学修目的に沿って体系的に授業科目を履修し、十分な学修成果をあげて円滑に卒業することに資するため、教育課程、履修方法、卒業要件等を一覧的に記した資料を作成して、これを学生に提供するものとする。

(Provision of materials relating to registration)

Article 38 The University of Tsukuba shall prepare and provide materials describing the curricula, registration methods, and graduation requirements to students so that students can systematically study and complete class subjects according to their education curriculum, course registration, and graduation requirements.

## 第6章 卒業及び学位授与

### Chapter 6 Graduation and Degree Conferral

(卒業)

第39条 学長は、筑波大学に4年以上（医学類にあつては6年以上）在学し、所属する学群等における部局細則又は法人細則に規定する卒業の要件として必要な授業科目を履修し、及びその単位を修得した学生について、人文・文化学群、社会・国際学群、人間学群、生命環境学群、理工学群、

情報学群及び医学群にあつては学類教育会議及び学群運営委員会、体育専門学群、芸術専門学群及び学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群にあつては専門学群教育会議、グローバル教育院にあつては学位プログラム教育会議及びグローバル教育院会議の議を経て、その卒業を認定する。

- 2 前項の部局細則で定める卒業の要件として必要な単位数は、124単位以上（医学類にあつては196単位以上）でなければならない。
- 3 第1項の規定により、部局細則を定めるに当たっては、卒業の要件として修得すべき単位数のうち、第24条第4項に定める授業の方法により修得する単位数は60単位を超えないものとする。

#### (Graduation)

Article 39 The president shall approve the graduation of a student who has attended the University of Tsukuba for at least four years (at least six years in the case of the College of Medicine), has completed class subjects that are necessary for graduation as stipulated in the detailed department regulations or detailed corporate regulations in the school in which the student is registered, and has received credits for such subject-area classes upon deliberation with the Education Council of the college and the School Operations Committee for the School of Humanities and Culture, School of Social and International Studies, School of Human Sciences, School of Life and Environmental Sciences, School of Science and Engineering, School of Informatics, School of Medicine and Health Sciences; the Education Council of the school for the School of Physical Education, Health and Sport Sciences, School of Art and Design, and School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design; and the Degree Program Faculty Meeting and the Education Council of the School of Integrative and Global Majors for the School of Integrative and Global Majors.

- 2 The number of credits that are necessary for graduation as prescribed in the detailed department regulations as noted in Chapter 6, Article 39, Paragraph 1, shall be at least 124 (at least 196 in the case of the College of Medicine).
- 3 Out of the credits to be acquired as graduation requirements in formulating the detailed department regulations pursuant to the provision of paragraph (1), the number of credits which are acquired in the class methods set forth in Article 24, Paragraph 4 shall not exceed 60 credits.

#### (早期卒業)

第40条 前条第1項の規定にかかわらず、学長は、筑波大学に3年以上在学した学生（医学類に在学する者を除き、学校教育法施行規則第149条の規定に該当する者を含む。）が、卒業の要件として同条第2項に定める単位を優秀な成績で修得したと認める場合であつて、かつ、当該学生が卒業を希望する場合には、人文・文化学群、社会・国際学群、人間学群、生命環境学群、理工学群、情報学群及び医学群にあつては学類教育会議及び学群運営委員会、体育専門学群、芸術専門学群及び学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群にあつては専門学群教育会議、グローバル教育院にあつては学位プログラム教育会議及びグローバル教育院会議の議を経て、その卒業を認定することができる。

#### (Early graduation)

Article 40 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 6, Article 39, Paragraph 1, if the president considers that a student who has attended the University of Tsukuba for three years or longer (excluding such students attending the College of Medicine but including students whose situation pertains to the provisions of Article 149 of the Regulation for Enforcement of the School Education Act) and has completed the number of credits necessary for graduation as prescribed in Chapter 6, Article 39, paragraph 2 with excellent marks, if the said student desires to graduate from the University, the president may approve the student's graduation upon deliberation with the Education Council of the college and the School Operations Committee for the School of Humanities and Culture, School of Social and International Studies, School of Human Sciences, School of Life and Environmental Sciences, School of Science and Engineering, School of Informatics, School of

Medicine and Health Sciences; the Education Council of the school for the School of Physical Education, Health and Sport Sciences, School of Art and Design, and School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design; and the Degree Program Faculty Meeting and the Education Council of the School of Integrative and Global Majors for the School of Integrative and Global Majors.

(学位授与)

第41条 筑波大学を卒業した者には、学士の学位を授与する。

2 前項の学位に付記する専攻分野の名称は、別表第3のとおりとする。

3 前2項に規定するもののほか、学位に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人規程で定める。

(Degree conferral)

Article 41 A bachelor's degree will be granted on those who have graduated from the University of Tsukuba.

2 The name of the major added to the degree referred to in the preceding paragraph is to be as indicated in Appended Table 3.

3 In addition to the provisions of the preceding two paragraphs, necessary matters concerning degrees shall be as prescribed in the corporate rules upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

## 第7章 授業料

### Chapter 7 Tuition

(授業料の納付)

第42条 学生は、毎年度（学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群の学生にあつては9月1日から翌年8月31日までの1年の期間ごと）、別表第1に定める額の授業料を納付しなければならない。

ただし、学生が国費外国人留学生等である場合又は学長が特に定める場合は、この限りでない。

2 前項に規定する授業料の納付は、各年度に係る授業料について2期に区分して行うものとし、それぞれの期において納付する額は、年額の2分の1に相当する額とする。

3 前項の規定にかかわらず、学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群の学生に係る授業料の納付は、第1項本文に規定する期間に係る授業料について2期に区分して行うものとし、それぞれの期の区分及び納付する額は、次の表のとおりとする。

区分	マレーシア国籍を有する学生	マレーシア国籍を有する学生以外の学生
第1期（9月1日から翌年1月31日まで）	14,630リングット	15,880リングット
第2期（2月1日から8月31日まで）	20,370リングット	22,120リングット

4 第2項に規定する授業料の納付の時期は、第1期に係るものにあつては5月、第2期に係るものにあつては11月とする。

5 第3項に規定する授業料の納付の時期は、第1期に係るものにあつては9月、第2期に係るものにあつては2月とする。

6 前2項の規定にかかわらず、学生が申し出た場合には、第1期に係る授業料を納付するとき、第2期に係る授業料を併せて納付することができる。

7 納付された授業料は、返付しない。ただし、第44条の規定により授業料を免除された場合には、免除の額に相当する額を返付することができる。

8 前項本文の規定にかかわらず、第6項の規定により授業料を納付した学生の授業料の返付につ

いては、次のとおりとする。

- (1) 第2期に係る授業料の納付の時期前に休学した場合には、当該授業料に相当する額を返付することができる。
- (2) 第1期中に退学した場合には、第2期に係る授業料に相当する額を返付することができる。

(Tuition payment)

Article 42 Students must pay tuition of the amount specified in Appended Table 1 each academic year (for students in the School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design, for the one-year period from September 1st to August 31st of the following year); provided however, that this shall not apply to cases where the student is a Japanese Government (Monbukagakusho) Scholarship Student or where specially prescribed by the president.

2 The tuition payment prescribed in Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 1 shall be divided into two installments for each academic year, with the amount to be paid in each installment being equivalent to one-half of the annual amount.

3 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 2, tuition payment for students of the School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design shall be paid in two installments for the period specified in the main text of Chapter 7, Article 42, paragraph 1. The division of each installment and the amount to be paid shall be as shown in the following table.

First installment (from September 1st to January 31st of the following year)	MYR 14,630	MYR 15,880
Second installment (from February 1st to August 31st)	MYR 20,370	MYR 22,120

4 The tuition payment schedule prescribed in Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 2 shall be May for the first installment and November for the second installment.

5 The tuition payment schedule prescribed in Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 3 shall be September for the first installment and February for the second installment.

6 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 4 and Paragraph 5, if so desired, a student may pay tuition for the second installment together with the tuition for the first installment.

7 There will be no refund of tuition. However, in the case where a student is deemed exempt from tuition in accordance with Chapter 7, Article 44, an amount corresponding to such exemption may be refunded to the student.

8 Notwithstanding the provisions of Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 7, if a student who has paid the tuition in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 7, Article 42, Paragraph 6, refund of such tuition fees may be undertaken as follows.

- (i) In the case where the student takes a leave of absence from the University before the time when the tuition for the second six-month period is to be paid, an amount corresponding to such tuition may be refunded to the student.
- (ii) In the case where the student withdraws from the University during the first six-month period, an amount corresponding to the tuition of the second six-month period may be refunded to the student.

(休学者の授業料)

第43条 休学を許可され、又は命ぜられた学生については、法人規程で定めるところにより、休学した日の属する月又はその翌月から復学した日の属する月又はその前月までの授業料を免除することができる。

(Tuition of students who takes a leave of absence)

Article 43 Students who are permitted or ordered to take leave of absence may be exempted from tuition for the period from the month following the month of the beginning date of their leave of absence to the month preceding the month of their reinstatement date, in accordance with the provisions of the corporate rules.

(授業料の免除)

第44条 学長は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する場合には、授業料の全部又は一部を免除することができる。

- (1) 大学等における修学の支援に関する法律第8条第1項に規定する要件に該当する場合
- (2) 施行規則第9条第3項非該当者であって、経済的理由によって納付が困難であり、かつ、学業優秀と認められる場合
- (3) 施行規則第9条第3項非該当者であって、授業料の各期ごとの納付の時期前6月以内（新入学者に対する入学した日の属する期分の免除に係る場合は、入学前1年以内）において、学資負担者が死亡し、又は当該学生若しくは学資負担者が風水害等の災害を受け、納付が著しく困難であると認められる場合
- (4) その他学長が相当と認める事由があるものとして法人規程で定めるものに該当する場合

2 前項の規定は、学際サイエンス・デザイン専門学群の学生には、適用しない。

(Tuition exemptions)

Article 44 The president may grant all or part of a tuition exemption in any of the following items.

- (i) When the requirements prescribed in Paragraph 1, Article 8 of the Act on Support in Education at Universities, Etc. are met
- (ii) For a person not applicable to Paragraph 3, Article 9 of the Order for Enforcement, in the case where it is difficult for the person to pay for economic reasons and who is found to do well at school
- (iii) For a person not applicable to Paragraph 3, Article 9 of the Order for Enforcement, in the case where the school expense payer dies or if the student or the school expense payer suffers storm and flood damage within six months prior to the time when the tuition for the relevant term are to be paid (within one year prior to admission in the case of exemption from tuition fees for the term under which the date of admission falls) and it is considered to be extremely difficult to pay the tuition fees.
- (iv) In the case where the president considers it otherwise reasonable that the student falls under the provisions of the corporate rules.

2 Provisions of Chapter 7, Article 44, Paragraph 1 do not apply to students in the School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design.

(授業料の徴収猶予)

第45条 学長は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する場合には、授業料の徴収を猶予することができる。

- (1) 経済的理由によって納付期限までに納付が困難であり、かつ、学業優秀と認められる場合
- (2) 行方不明の場合
- (3) 学生又は学資負担者が災害を受け、納付が困難であると認められる場合
- (4) その他学長が相当と認める事由があるものとして法人規程で定めるものに該当する場合

(Deferment of tuition)

Article 45 The president may grant a grace period for the payment of tuition in any of the following items.

- (i) In the case where it is difficult for a student, who is deemed to be an excellent prospect, to pay the tuition fees on or before the due date for economic reasons.
- (ii) In the case where the student's whereabouts are unknown.
- (iii) In the case where the student or the school expense payer suffers storm and flood damage and it is considered extremely difficult to pay tuition fees.
- (iv) In the case where the president considers it otherwise reasonable that the student falls under the provisions of the corporate rules.

(法人規程への委任)

第46条 前3条に規定するもののほか、授業料の免除及び徴収猶予に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Delegation to the corporate rules)

Article 46 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 7, Articles 43, 44, and 45 inclusive, any necessary matters relating to exemption from, and deferment of payment of tuition shall be prescribed in the corporate rules.

## 第8章 休学、転学、留学及び退学

### Chapter 8 Leave of Absence, Transfer, Study Abroad and Withdrawal

(休学)

第47条 疾病その他特別の理由により、引き続き2月以上修学することができない学生は、学群長等又は総合学域群長の許可を得て、休学することができる。

- 2 疾病のため修学することが適当でないと認められる学生については、法人細則で定めるところにより、学群長等又は総合学域群長が休学を命ずる。

(Leave of absence)

Article 47 Any student who cannot attend the University for two consecutive months or longer due to illness or other special circumstances may take a leave of absence after obtaining approval from deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies.

- 2 Deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies shall order a student whose attendance at the School is considered insufficient due to illness to take a leave of absence in accordance with the provisions of the detailed corporate regulations.

(休学期間)

第48条 前条により許可又は命ずることができる休学期間は、1年以内とする。ただし、特別の理由があると認められるときは、学群長等又は総合学域群長は、さらに1年を超えない範囲内で、休学期間の延長を許可又は命ずることができる。

- 2 休学期間は、通算して3年を超えることができない。
- 3 休学期間は、修業年限及び在学年限に算入しない。

(Period of leave of absence)

Article 48 The period of leave of absence that may be ordered or permitted under the preceding Article shall be 1 year or less; provided however, that when it is deemed to have a special reason, deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may permit or order the extension of the period of leave of absence

within the limit of not more than another year.

2 Any extensions to a period of a leave of absence shall not exceed three years in total.

3 The period of the leave of absence shall not be included in the course term and the maximum enrollment duration.

(復学)

第49条 休学期間中にその理由が消滅した学生は、学群長等又は総合学域群長の許可を得て、復学することができる。

(Re-enrollment)

Article 49 Students may return to the University after obtaining permission from deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies if the circumstances for the leave of absence have been resolved.

(転学)

第50条 他の大学へ入学又は転入学を志願しようとする学生は、学長の許可を受けなければならない。

(School transfer)

Article 50 Students who desire to enter or transfer to other universities shall obtain permission from the president.

(留学)

第51条 学群長、グローバル教育院長及び総合学域群長は、教育上有益と認めるときは、外国の大学等との協議に基づき、学生が当該外国の大学等で学修することを目的とする留学を許可することができる。

2 前項の許可により留学できる期間（以下「留学期間」という。）は、1年以内とする。ただし、やむを得ない事情があると認められるときは、学群長等又は総合学域群長は、さらに1年を超えない範囲内で、留学期間の延長を許可することができる。

3 留学期間は、通算して2年を超えることができない。

4 留学期間は、第39条第1項に定める在学期間を含めることができる。

5 外国の大学等へ留学し修得した単位の取扱いについては、第36条第4項の規定を準用する。

(Study abroad)

Article 51 Deans, the dean of SIGMA, and dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may permit a student to study abroad for the purpose of studying at a foreign university upon deliberation with such foreign universities when deeming it to be effective from an educational standpoint.

2 The period for which a student may study abroad (hereinafter referred to as the “study abroad period”), with permission as noted in Chapter 8, Article 51, Paragraph 1, shall be up to one year. However, deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies may permit an extension of the study abroad period for a further one-year period if there are unavoidable reasons.

3 The total duration of a study abroad period shall not exceed two years.

4 The study abroad period may be included in the attendance period as prescribed in Chapter 6, Article 39, Paragraph 1.

5 The provisions of Chapter 5, Article 36, Paragraph 4, shall apply to the handling of credits earned through study abroad at foreign universities.

(退学)

第52条 退学しようとする学生は、学長の許可を受けなければならない。

(Withdrawal)

Article 52 Students who intend to withdraw from the University shall obtain permission from the president.

(法人細則への委任)

第53条 第47条から前条までに規定するもののほか、休学、復学、転学、留学及び退学に関し必要な事項は、法人細則で定める。

(Delegation to the detailed corporate regulations)

Article 53 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 8, Articles 47 to 52 inclusive, any necessary matters relating to leave of absence, reinstatement, transfer, study abroad, and withdrawal shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.

(除籍)

第54条 次の各号のいずれかに該当する学生は、学長が除籍する。

- (1) 授業料の納付を怠り、督促してもなお納付しない者
- (2) 在学年限を超えた者
- (3) 年間15単位以上（医学類にあつてはこれに相当する単位又は授業科目の履修）を修得することができない者（特別の理由により、あらかじめ学群長等又は総合学域群長の許可を受けた者を除く。）
- (4) 第48条第1項及び第2項に規定する休学期間を超えて、なお修学できない者
- (5) 入学料の免除又は徴収猶予を申請した者のうち、免除若しくは徴収猶予が不許可となった者若しくは半額免除が許可となった者で、所定の期日までに入学料を納付しないもの又は徴収猶予が許可となった者で、徴収猶予期間を超えて、なお入学料を納付しないもの

2 前項に規定するもののほか、除籍に関し必要な事項は、別に定める。

(Expulsion)

Article 54 Students whose situations fall under any of the following items shall be expelled from the University by the president.

- (i) Students who fail to pay tuition, even after being demanded to do so by the University.
- (ii) Students who exceed the maximum enrollment duration.
- (iii) Students who fail to attain 15 credits or more each year (or completion of credits or class subjects corresponding thereto in the case of the College of Medicine), excluding students who have obtained the permission of deans, etc. or the dean of the School of Comprehensive Studies in advance for special reasons.
- (iv) Students who cannot attend the University after their period of leave of absence lapses, as prescribed in Chapter 8, Article 48, Paragraphs 1 and 2.
- (v) Students who a) have not been granted an admission fee exemption or deferment or who have been granted a partial deferment, but do not pay their admission fee by the due date, or b) have received a deferment of their admissions fee but who do not pay their admissions fee by the end of the deferral period.

2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 8, Article 54, Paragraph 1, any necessary matters relating to expulsion shall be provided separately.

## 第9章 収容定員及び入学定員

### Chapter 9 Enrollment Capacity and Admission Capacity

(収容定員及び入学定員)

第55条 学群又は学類ごとの収容定員及び入学定員は、別表第4のとおりとする。

(Enrollment capacity and admission capacity)

Article 55 The enrollment capacity and admission capacity relating to each school or college is to be as indicated in Appended Table 4.

## 第10章 修学及び学生生活の支援等

### Chapter 10 Support for Academic Studies and Student Affairs

(修学及び学生生活の支援並びにクラス)

第56条 法人は、学生の円滑な修学及び学生生活を支援するために必要な措置を講じるとともに、必要な指導助言を行うことに努めなければならない。

- 2 学長は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、前項の学生の円滑な修学及び学生生活の支援並びに指導助言に関する基本方針を定める。
- 3 学長は、前項で定めた基本方針に基づき、学生の円滑な修学のための支援及び円滑な学生生活のための支援について、統一的な取扱いを告示するものとする。
- 4 学生の円滑な修学及び学生生活の支援並びに指導助言を行うため、クラスを設けるものとする。
- 5 前項のクラスに関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人規程で定める。

(Support for academic studies, student affairs, and “classes”<sup>24</sup>)

Article 56 The corporation shall take all necessary measures and shall endeavor to provide all necessary guidance and advice in order to facilitate support for academic studies and student affairs.

- 2 The president shall determine the basic policy for facilitating support for academic studies and student affairs, as well as guidance and advice, upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.
- 3 The president, based upon the basic policy specified in the preceding paragraph, shall notify the systematic handling of support for the smooth education of the student and smooth campus life.
- 4 “Classes” shall be conducted in order to facilitate support for academic studies and student affairs as well as to provide guidance and advice.
- 5 Any necessary matters relating to classes as noted in Chapter 10, Article 56, Paragraph 4, shall be prescribed in the corporate rules upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(学生の活動)

第57条 学生団体の設立、集会、掲示その他の学生の活動に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人規程で定める。

(Activities of students)

Article 57 Any necessary matters relating to student activities, such as the establishment of student organizations, assembly, posting notices, among other activities, shall be prescribed in the corporate rules upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(学生の行為の制限)

第58条 学生は、次に掲げる行為を行ってはならない。

- (1) 試験等の適正な実施を妨げること。
- (2) 法人の施設、設備及び環境を損なうこと。
- (3) この法人規則その他の法人の規則の規定に反すること。
- (4) 秩序を乱し、その他学生の本分に反すること。

(Restrictions on student conducts)

Article 58 Students must not engage in the following activities:

- (i) Obstruct the proper administration of examinations, etc.
- (ii) Damage the corporation's facilities, equipment or environment.
- (iii) Breach the provisions of the Corporate Regulations or other regulations of the corporation.
- (iv) Disturb the public order or engage in other deviations from their responsibilities as students.

(学生証)

第58条の2 学長は、学生が入学（編入学、転入学及び再入学を含む。）したとき、他の学群等へ移籍したとき又は学類若しくは芸術専門学群へ移行したときは、学生証を交付するものとする。

2 前項に規定するもののほか、学生証に関し必要な事項は、法人細則で定める。

(Student identification cards)

Article 58-2 The president shall issue a student identification card to each student upon entering the University (including transfer and re-entry) or upon transferring to another School or College.

2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 10, Article 58-2, Paragraph 1, any necessary matters relating to student identification cards shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.

## 第11章 賞罰

### Chapter 11 Awards and Disciplinary Measures

(学生表彰)

第59条 学長は、学生表彰を行うことができる。

2 学長が学生表彰を行う場合には、学生生活を担当する副学長の下に置かれる委員会において、その選考を行う。

3 学生表彰に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Students commendations)

Article 59 The president may commend students.

2 If the president commends students, screening shall be conducted by a committee established under the vice president for student affairs.

3 Any necessary matters relating to student commendations shall be prescribed in the corporate rules.

(懲戒)

第60条 学長は、この法人規則その他の法人の規則に違反した学生又は学生としての本分に反する行為をした学生を懲戒することができる。

2 前項の懲戒の種類は、懲戒退学、停学及び訓告とする。

3 学長が懲戒を行う場合には、第1項に定める事由に該当するか否かについて、学生生活を担当する副学長の下に置かれる委員会において、事実の調査及び確認を行うことを常例とする。

4 学長が懲戒を行った場合は、学籍簿にその旨を記載する。

(Disciplinary action)

Article 60 The president may impose disciplinary measures on a student who breaches these Corporate Regulations and other regulations of the corporation or who commits acts deviating from the students' responsibilities.

2 The types of disciplinary measures noted in Chapter 11, Article 60, Paragraph 1, shall consist of disciplinary expulsion, suspension and admonishment.

3 If the president imposes disciplinary measures on a student, the facts shall be investigated and confirmed by the committee established under the vice president for student affairs as to whether the circumstances involving such student fall under the provisions of Chapter 11, Article 60, Paragraph 1.

4 If the president imposes disciplinary measures on a student, such disciplinary measures shall be noted on the said student's record.

(懲戒退学)

第61条 懲戒退学は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する学生に対して行う。

(1) 性行不良で改善の見込みがない者

(2) 正当な理由がなくて出席常でない者

(3) 秩序を乱し、その他学生としての本分に著しく反した者

2 学長は、懲戒退学を行う場合には、教育研究評議会の議を経るものとする。

(Disciplinary expulsion)

Article 61 Disciplinary expulsion shall be imposed on a student in any of the following items.

(i) Students who exhibit bad behavior and are unlikely to improve their behavior.

(ii) Students who are often absent from the University without justifiable reason(s).

(iii) Students who disturb the public order or who otherwise demonstrate extreme deviation from their responsibilities as students.

2 The president shall impose disciplinary expulsion upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(停学)

第62条 停学の期間は、1年6月を超えない範囲で定めるものとする。

2 停学の期間は、在学年限に算入し、修業年限に算入しない。ただし、1月を超えないときは、修業年限に算入することができる。

3 学長は、停学を命じる場合には、教育研究評議会の議を経るものとする。

(Suspension)

Article 62 The suspension period shall be a period not exceeding one year and six months.

2 The suspension period shall be included in the period of maximum enrollment duration but shall not be included in the course term. However, if the suspension period does not exceed one month, the suspension

period of suspension may be included in the course term.

3 The president may order suspension upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(訓告)

第63条 学長は、訓告を行う場合には、教育研究評議会の議を経るものとする。

(Admonishment)

Article 63 The president may deliver admonishment upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(法人規程への委任)

第64条 第60条から前条までに規定するもののほか、学生の懲戒に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人規程で定める。

(Delegation to the corporate rules)

Article 64 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 11, Articles 60 to 63, any necessary matters relating to disciplinary measures imposed on students shall be prescribed in the corporate rules upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

## 第12章 学生居住施設

### Chapter 12 Student Residence Halls

(学生居住施設)

第65条 法人は、学生の円滑な修学を支援するために、学生居住施設を設置する。

2 学生居住施設の管理及び運営に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Student residence halls)

Article 65 The corporation shall establish student residence halls in order to facilitate their studies.

2 Any necessary matters relating to the management and operation of student residence halls shall be prescribed in the corporate rules.

(寄宿料の納付)

第66条 学生居住施設に居住する学生は、別表第1に定める額の寄宿料を納付しなければならない。

2 納付された寄宿料は、返付しない。ただし、次条の規定により寄宿料を免除された場合には、免除の額に相当する額を返付することができる。

(Payment of residency fees)

Article 66 A student who lives in the student residence halls shall pay residency fees as prescribed in Appended Table 1.

2 There will be no refund of residency fees. However, in the case where a student is deemed exempt from residency fees in accordance with Chapter 11, Article 67, an amount corresponding to such exemption may be refunded to the student.

(寄宿料の免除)

第67条 学長は、次の各号のいずれかに該当する場合には、寄宿料を免除することができる。

- (1) 学生又は学資負担者が風水害等の災害を受け、納付が著しく困難であると認められる場合
- (2) その他学長が相当と認める事由があるものとして法人規程で定めるものに該当する場合

(Housing fee exemption)

Article 67 The president may grant an exemption from residency fees in any of the following items.

- (i) In the case where a student or the school expense payer suffers storm and flood damage and it is considered extremely difficult for them to pay the residency fees.
- (ii) In the case where the president considers it otherwise reasonable that the student falls under the provisions of the corporate rules.

(法人規程への委任)

第68条 前2条に規定するもののほか、寄宿料の納付及び免除に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Delegation to the corporate rules)

Article 68 In addition to the provisions contained in Chapter 12, Article 67, any necessary matters relating to residency fees payment and exemption shall be prescribed in the corporate rules.

### 第13章 科目等履修生等 Chapter 13 Credited Auditors, Etc.

(科目等履修生)

第69条 学長は、筑波大学において一又は複数の授業科目を履修することを志願した者を、選考の上、科目等履修生とすることができる。

- 2 科目等履修生が授業科目を履修した場合には、試験等により学修の成果を評価して所定の単位を授与する。
- 3 前2項に規定するもののほか、科目等履修生に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人細則で定める。

(Credited auditors)

Article 69 The president may deem a person who applies to register in one or more class subjects at the University of Tsukuba to be a credited auditor after screening.

- 2 A credited auditor who has taken a class subject is granted a predetermined credit by assessing the student's academic achievement through examination, etc.
- 3 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 69, Paragraphs 1 and 2, any necessary matters relating to credited auditors shall be as prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(研究生)

第70条 学長は、筑波大学において特定の専門事項について研究することを志願した者を、選考の上、研究生とすることができる。

- 2 前項に規定するもののほか、研究生に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人細則で定める。

(Research students)

Article 70 The president may deem a person who applies to conduct research in a specific field at the University of Tsukuba to be a non-degree research student after screening.

- 2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 70, Paragraph 1, any necessary matters relating to non-degree research students shall be as prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(特別聴講学生)

第71条 学長は、他大学等又は外国の大学等との協議に基づき、それらの学生であって、筑波大学において授業科目を履修することを志願したものを、法人細則で定めるところにより、特別聴講学生とすることができる。

- 2 前項に規定するもののほか、特別聴講学生に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、法人細則で定める。

(Exchange students)

Article 71 The president may allow a person who is a student of another university or foreign university and who applies for registration in a class subject at the University upon deliberation with said university to be an exchange student in accordance with the provisions of the detailed corporate regulations.

- 2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 71, Paragraph 1, any necessary matters relating to exchange students shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations upon deliberation with the Education and Research Council.

(日本語研修生)

第71条の2 学長は、外国人留学生等日本語研修コースの日本語予備教育コースを受講する者を、日本語研修生とすることができる。

- 2 前項に規定するもののほか、日本語研修生に関し必要な事項は、教育研究評議会の議を経て、部局細則で定める。

(Students of Intensive Japanese Training)

Article 71-2 The president may allow a person who attends summer Japanese language educational course of Japanese language training course for international students to be an intensive Japanese language course student.

- 2 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 71, Paragraph 1 and any necessary matters relating to intensive Japanese language course students shall be as prescribed in the detailed department regulations upon deliberation with the Educational Research Council.

(科目等履修生等の授業料等)

第72条 第69条第1項又は第70条第1項の規定により、科目等履修生又は研究生となることを志願する者は、出願のときに法人規程で定める額の検定料を納付しなければならない。ただし、法人規程で定める場合は、この限りでない。

- 2 第69条第1項又は第70条第1項の選考に合格した者が科目等履修生又は研究生となることを希望するときは、入学手続のときに、法人規程で定める額の入学料及び授業料を納付しなけれ

ばならない。ただし、法人規程で定める場合は、この限りでない。

- 3 第71条第1項の規定により、特別聴講学生となることを志願する者は、入学手続のときに、法人規程で定める額の授業料を納付しなければならない。ただし、法人規程で定める場合は、この限りでない。
- 4 前3項に規定するもののほか、科目等履修生、研究生及び特別聴講学生の検定料、入学料及び授業料に関し必要な事項は、法人規程で定める。

(Tuition, etc. of credited auditors, etc.)

- Article 72 Persons who apply to become credited auditors or non-degree research students in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 69, Paragraph 1, or Chapter 13, Article 70, Paragraph 1, shall pay the examination fee in the amount as prescribed in the corporate rules when their application is filed; provided however, that this does not apply to the cases specified by the corporate rules.
- 2 If a person wishing to become a credited auditor or a non-degree research student passes the screening noted in the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 69, Article 1 or Chapter 13, Article 70, Paragraph 1, the said person shall pay the admission fee and tuition in the amount prescribed in the corporate rules when the admission procedures are undertaken; provided however, that this does not apply to the cases specified by the corporate rules.
  - 3 A person who applies to become an exchange student in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 71, Paragraph 1 shall pay the admission fee and tuition in the amount prescribed in the Corporate Regulations when the admission procedures are undertaken; provided however, that this does not apply to the cases specified by the corporate rules.
  - 4 In addition to the provisions of Chapter 13, Article 72, Paragraphs 1 to 3, any necessary matters relating to examination fee, admission fee and tuition of credited auditors, non-degree research students and exchange students shall be prescribed in the corporate rules.

#### 附 則

- 1 この法人規則は、平成16年4月1日から施行する。
- 2 国立大学法人法附則第17条の規定により国立大学法人の成立の際、図書館情報大学に在学する学生は、当該大学を卒業するため必要であった教育課程の履修を、筑波大学において行うものとし、筑波大学は、そのため必要な教育を行うものとする。
- 3 図書館情報大学を卒業するため必要であった教育課程の履修その他当該学生の教育に関し必要な事項は、法人細則で定める。
- 4 第19条第4項に規定する筑波大学には、図書館情報大学を含むものとする。

#### Supplementary Provisions

- 1 These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from April 1, 2004.
- 2 Students who attended the University of Library and Information Science when National University Corporations were established in accordance with the provisions of Article 17 of the Supplementary Provisions of the National University Corporation Act shall complete the education curriculum at the University of Tsukuba which were necessary for graduation from the University of Library and Information Science and the University of Tsukuba shall provide the necessary education to such students.
- 3 Any necessary matters relating to the completion of the education curriculum necessary for graduation from the University of Library and Information Science and the education of such students shall be prescribed in the detailed corporate regulations.
- 4 The use of the term relating to the “University of Tsukuba” as prescribed in Chapter 4, Article 19, Paragraph 4, shall include the University of Library and Information Science.

附 則（平 1 6 . 4 . 1 5 法人規則 2 4 号）  
この法人規則は、平成 1 6 年 4 月 1 5 日から施行する。

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 24 of April 15, 2004)  
These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from April 15, 2004.

この法人規則は、平成 1 6 年 4 月 2 2 日から施行する。

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 27 of April 22, 2004)  
These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from April 22, 2004.

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 2 of February 24, 2005)  
These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from February 24, 2005.

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 36 of March 24, 2005)  
These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from April 1, 2005.

この法人規則は、平成 1 7 年 7 月 2 1 日から施行する。

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 47 of July 21, 2005)  
These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from July 21, 2005.

附 則（平 1 7 . 9 . 2 9 法人規則 5 1 号）  
1 この法人規則は、平成 1 7 年 9 月 2 9 日から施行する。  
2 この法人規則の施行の際現に学生証の交付を受けている者については、この法人規則による改正後の国立大学法人筑波大学学群学則第 5 8 条の 2 第 1 項の規定により交付を受けたものとみなす。

Supplementary Provisions (Corporate Regulations No. 51 of September 29, 2005)  
1 These Corporate Regulations shall come into effect as from September 29, 2005.  
2 Students who have already received a student identification card when these Corporate Regulations came into effect shall be deemed to have received such a card pursuant to the provisions of Paragraph 1, Article 58-2 of the National University Corporation University of Tsukuba School Regulations after the revision by these Corporate Regulations.

附 則（平 1 7 . 1 2 . 2 2 法人規則 6 5 号）

#### **Purpose**

**Article 1:** The purpose of these Departmental Specific Regulations shall be to define matters related to human resource development and other education and research purpose (referred to in Article 1-2 as “purposes of human resource development”) and the structure of the academic curriculum and requirements for completing courses at the School of Social and International Studies (hereinafter referred to as “the School”) in accordance with the provisions of Article 1-2, paragraph (1) , Article 25, paragraph (1), Article 25-2, paragraph (2), Article 28, paragraph (1), Article 31, paragraph (1), Article 33, Article 35, paragraph (3), Article 39 and Article 40 of the Specific Regulations of the University of Tsukuba (Specific Regulations No. 10 of 2004, hereinafter referred to as “The Undergraduate School Regulations”).

#### **Purposes of Human Resource Development**

**Article 1-2:** According to Article 1-2, paragraph (1) of the Undergraduate School Regulations, the School aims to encourage students to study in detail various topics of contemporary society on a global scale, as well as to analyze complex situations and concrete problems to meet the demands

of our society.

(2) Purposes of human resource development shall be as follows.

Colleges	Purposes of Human Resource Development
Social Sciences	The College of Social Sciences provides interdisciplinary education in the fields of sociology, law, political science and economics. Students may gain a fundamental understanding in each field, and also develop specialist knowledge and skills. We encourage students to become highly skilled Glocal (understanding both global and local considerations) professionals who have a fundamental understanding of the social sciences.
International Studies	In globalization, more complex international issues have been arising. The college cultivates students to develop deep insights into the essence of such issues, master information technology and to learn analysis skills. We aim to educate students who can become actively involved on the international stage with the vision and assertiveness to propose unique solutions to others.

**Major Field of Study**

**Article 2:** Major fields set forth in the provisions of Article 25, paragraph (1) of The Undergraduate School Regulations shall be as follows.

Colleges	Major Fields
Social Sciences	Sociology, Law, Political Science, Economics
International Studies	International Relations, International Development

(2) In addition to those mentioned above, the school offers English course named the International Social Sciences.

**Completion of Courses, etc.**

**Article 3:** Graduation requirements of classes and credits from *Major Subjects, Foundation Subjects for Major*, and *General Foundation Subjects* for each main field in the School shall be as described in the Supplementary Table No. 1 (not listed).

International Social Sciences (English Course) should follow Supplementary Table No.1-1.

**Requirement for Main Field Selection**

**Article 4:** With regard to the College of Social Sciences, courses and credits to be acquired prior to selecting main field shall be as described in the Supplementary Table No. 2 (not listed); provided, however, that this shall not apply to students with main fields determined in the year of enrollment.

**Maximum Credit Load**

**Article 5:** The maximum credit load per academic year shall be 45 credits as set forth in the provisions of Article 33, paragraph (1) of The Undergraduate School Regulations.

(2) Criteria and number of credits in the case of approval of exceeding the maximum credit load for class registration prescribed in the provisions of Article 33, paragraph (2) of The Undergraduate School Regulations shall be as described in the Supplementary Table No. 3 (not listed).

International Social Sciences (English Course) should follow Supplementary Table No.3-1.

**Grade Evaluation**

**Article 6:** Grade marks of P and F shall be given for *the First Year Seminar, the Invitation to Arts and Sciences, Information Literacy (Exercises), Tutorial for Current Topics in Sociology, Tutorial for Current Topics in Law, Tutorial for Current Topics in Political Science, Tutorial for Current Topics in Economics, Tutorial for International Studies I, Tutorial for International Studies II, Tutorial for International Studies III and Tutorial for International Studies IV* as prescribed in the

provisions of Article 35, paragraph (3) of The Undergraduate School Regulations.

(2) No subject shall be excluded from GPA grading in semester and cumulative GPA of the GPA system of the School (the subjects hereinafter refer to as “subjects to be excluded from GPA grading in the semester and cumulative GPA”); provided, however, that International Social Sciences (English Course) designate Specific Foundation Subjects in General Foundation Subjects as the subjects to be excluded from GPA grading in the semester and cumulative GPA.

**Article 7:** Eligible students for early graduation standards as set forth in the provisions of Article 40 of The Undergraduate School Regulations shall be as described in the Supplementary Table No. 4 (not listed).

International Social Sciences (English Course) should follow Supplementary Table No.4-1.

**Article 8:** In addition to the regulations prescribed in these Departmental Specific Regulations, the Chairs of each College shall determine and notify students throughout the university upon consultation with the Faculty Council regarding requirements for completion in the relevant College.

### **Purpose**

**Article 1:** The purpose of these Detailed Division Regulations is to define matters related to human resource development and other education and research purposes (referred to in Article 1-2 as “purposes of human resource development”) and the construction of the academic curriculum and matters necessary for the completion of courses in the School of Life and Environmental Sciences (in accordance with the provisions of Article 1-2, paragraph [1], Article 25, Article 28, Article 31, Article 33, Article 35, paragraph [3], Article 39 and Article 40 of University of Tsukuba Undergraduate School Rules [Specific Regulations No. 10 of 2004, hereafter referred to as “Undergraduate School Rules”]).

### **Objective: Cultivation of Human Resource Development**

**Article 1-2:** According to Article 1-2, paragraph [1] of the Undergraduate School Rules, the purpose of the School of Life and Environmental Sciences is to foster graduates with the skills and outlook required to become global leaders in future, and a strong capacity to discover and solve the problems. Students develop a comprehensive understanding of biological phenomena of various organisms including human,

the evolution of the earth and dynamics of the environment, and methods of conservation and sustainable use of biological resources.

(2) The purposes of human resource development set by the respective Colleges shall be as follows;

Colleges	Purposes of Human Resource Development and of Education and Research
College of Biological Sciences	The College of Biological Sciences aims to foster graduates who can bridge society and advanced sciences, with a well-developed mechanistic understanding of living organisms and biological systems, research methods for biology, and the significance of advanced research. Our graduates are equipped to become researchers, educators, engineers, and business people who are globally active in various academic fields related to biology.
College of Agro-Biological Resource Sciences	The College of Agro-Biological Resource Sciences aims to provide comprehensive knowledge about the effective use of plants, animals and microorganisms for safe and comfortable human life, and to nurture students who can contribute the local and global issues such as food security and environmental conservation, through development and sustainable use of biological resources.
College of Geoscience	Geoscience addresses issues relating to the evolution of the Earth, the natural processes on the Earth's surface, in the Earth's atmosphere, lithosphere, hydrosphere, and the interactions between natural environments and human activities. The aim of our education is to help students acquire profound knowledge of and comprehensive insight into the Earth. Our program covers a wide variety of subjects, and encourages students to seek their carriers in academia, education, and governments, as well as in companies.

### Main Fields of Study

**Article 2:** The Major fields set forth in the provisions of Article 25 of the Undergraduate School Rules shall be as follows.

### Completion of Courses, etc.

**Article 3:** Courses and the number of credits, etc. required for graduation from *Major Subjects*, *Foundation Subjects for Major*, and *General Foundation Subjects* for each major field for the School of Life and Environmental Sciences set forth in provisions of Article 39, paragraph [1] of the Undergraduate School Rules, shall be described in Supplementary Table No. 1.

(2) With regard to the College of Geoscience, subjects and the number of credits required prior to selecting from the Major fields set forth in the Article 2, paragraph [1] shall be described in Supplementary Table No. 2.

### Sub Fields of Study

**Article 4:** When selecting the sub fields of study, according to Article 2, the Dean can accept and register one subject among other schools' major fields.

(2) With regard to the College of Geoscience, terms and conditions of sub-fields shall be described in Supplementary Table No. 3.

### Maximum Limit for Course Registration

**Article 5:** The maximum limit per academic year shall be 45 credits (in accordance with Article 33, paragraph [1] of the Undergraduate School Rules).

(2) In case of the preceding paragraph, courses related to teacher's license, courses related to museum, and intensive courses offered during summer, winter, and spring recesses shall be excluded.

(3) Requirements and number of credits in the case of approval for exceeding the maximum limit in accordance with Article 33, paragraph [2] of the Undergraduate School Rules shall be as in the following table.

### Specific Regulations for the School of Science and Engineering, University of Tsukuba

#### Purpose

**Article 1:** The purpose of these Detailed Division Regulations shall be to define the goal of human resource development and of education and research (hereinafter referred to as “goal of human resource development”), as well as any necessary matters concerning curriculum design and its course registration in the School of Science and Engineering (in accordance with the provisions of Article 1-2, paragraph (1), Article 25, Article 25-2, Article 28, Article 31, Article 33, Article 35, paragraph (3), Article 39 and Article 40 of the University of Tsukuba Undergraduate School Rules [Detailed University Regulations No. 10 of 2004, hereinafter referred to as “The Undergraduate School Rules”] as well as the provision of Article 4 of Implementation Guidelines for the GPA System of the University of Tsukuba [decided at the fourth Education Council of the Colleges in 2012. Hereafter referred to as “Implementation Guidelines”]).

#### Goal of Human Resource Development

**Article 1-2:** According to the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in Article 1-2, paragraph (1) of the Undergraduate School Rules, the goal of human resource development set by the School of Science and Engineering shall be as follows:

The School of Science and Engineering aims to foster students to acquire a wide range of knowledge, necessary for the creation of a sustainable society, mainly through developing their expertise in the fields ranging from the basics to the applications in natural science and technology. The program nurtures students to have flexibility in thinking, to help them to develop intellectual creativity with problem findings and solving abilities. Thus, this program aims to the development of global human resources who can contribute to the global community through their wide overall vision, humanity and their skills of team-effort and so on.

**Paragraph 2:** According to the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in the Article 1-2 paragraph (1) of the Undergraduate School Rules, the goal of human resource development set by the respective Colleges under the School of Science and Engineering shall be as follows.

In this way, this college aims to develop human resources to be capable to participate actively in the various fields of the society.
College of Physics	The College of Physics aims to foster students to acquire a solid foundation and a high level of specialized knowledge about the diversely developing modern physics, and to attain a flexible cognitive skill nurtured through the processes of questing the truth, in addition to a problem-solving skill by providing insight on the nature of things. Thus, this college aims to develop human resources who can play an active role in various fields of society by making use of their respective abilities.
College of Chemistry	The College of Chemistry aims to foster students to have enough fundamental knowledge about chemistry to be able to possess enthusiasm for exploring the universal law, unknown substances and phenomena in the nature, for the development of materials, creation of functional materials, solution of environment and energy problems, and elucidation of biological phenomena at the molecular level.
College of Engineering Sciences	The College of Engineering Sciences aims to foster students to become engineers and researchers possessing innovation and creativity, being expert in the cutting-edge technology will contribute to the sustainability and development of the society.
College of Engineering Systems	The College of Engineering Systems aims to foster students to become engineers and researchers who can support and drive safe and secure, comfortable and productive, and sustainable human life in terms of engineering; that is, 1. Those who have a basic capability to apply their abilities for a wide range of the engineering fields, 2. Those who have a broad perspective for accomplishing duties, 3. Those who have basic human abilities as a member of society and a professional person.
College of Policy and Planning Sciences	The College of Policy and Planning Sciences aims to foster students to develop a thinking ability necessary for integration of arts and sciences, and the ability for analyzing and utilizing data technologically, practically and strategically to analyze various social problems caused by complicated human behaviors.

**Article 2:** Major fields set forth in the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in the Article 25 of The Undergraduate School Rules shall be as follows.

### Bachelor's Program in Interdisciplinary Engineering

**Article 2-2:** The School of Science and Engineering sets up Bachelor's Program in Interdisciplinary Engineering that provides interdisciplinary curriculum crossing the College of Engineering Sciences and the College of

Engineering Systems.

**Paragraph 2:** The major field of Bachelor’s Program in Interdisciplinary Engineering is interdisciplinary engineering.

**Paragraph 3:** In addition to what is described in the preceding paragraph 2, the goal of human resource development as well as any necessary matters concerning curriculum design and its course registration in Bachelor’s Program in Interdisciplinary Engineering shall be set up separately.

**Completion of Courses, etc.**

**Article 3:** The number of subjects and credits, required for graduation from each *Major Subject, Foundation Subject for Major,* and *General Foundation Subject* for each major field of the School of Science and Engineering, set forth in n the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in the Article 39, paragraph (1) of the Undergraduate School Rules, shall be described in Appended Table No. 1.

**Requirements for Major Field Selection**

**Article 4:** With regard to the selection of students’ major field for those who are in the College of Engineering Sciences, the College of Engineering Systems, and the College of Policy and Planning Sciences, the Dean of the school shall take into consideration of students’ requests, select their main major after the end of the academic year of their enrollment, and finally determine their main major after discussion with the Education Council of the College and the School Operation Committee for the School.

**Paragraph 2:** Subjects and credits to be acquired (hereafter referred to as “required subjects,”) prior to the selection of the major field shall be as described in the Supplementary Table No. 2 (not listed).

**Paragraph 3:** The Dean of the school may, when it deems to be effective, allow students to take a minor field which shall be selected from the major fields from a college concerned.

**Maximum Credits for Course Registration**

**Article 5:** The maximum credits allowed for course registration per academic year shall be 45 credits(excluding courses related to a teacher-training and curator certificate in addition to intensive courses offered during summer, winter, and spring recesses) as set forth in the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in the Article 33, paragraph (1) of The Undergraduate School Rules.

**Paragraph 2:** Requirements and the number of credits to get approval for course registration over the maximum credits, set forth in the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in the Article 33, paragraph (2) of The Undergraduate School Rules, shall be as in the following table.

### Registration on the Interdisciplinary Fields other than the Major Fields

**Article 6:** If students wish to select an interdisciplinary field other than the major fields, the Dean of the School shall manage the decision upon discussion in the Education Council of the College and the School Operations Committee for the School.

### Grade Evaluation

**Article 7:** According to the Detailed Division Regulations provisioned in Article 35, paragraph (3) of the Undergraduate School Rules, the grades of “P” or “F” shall be given to the subjects, *the First Year Seminar, Invitation to Arts and Sciences, Information Literacy (Exercises), Fundamental Analysis and Fundamental Linear Algebra* provided by the School of Science and Engineering, *Introduction to Mathematics, Career Path Seminar in the College of Mathematics* provided by the College of Mathematics, *Study of Physics Basic Seminar I and II, Class Seminar I, Seminar for Topic Research Practice 1 and 2, Special Physics Seminar 1 & 2,* and *Introductory Physics* provided by the College of Physics, *Introduction to Chemistry, Study of Chemistry Basic Seminar*, provided by the College of Chemistry as well as *Introduction to Engineering Sciences* provided by the College of Engineering Sciences, as well as *Introduction to Inclusive Smart Society I, Introduction to Inclusive Smart Society II* and *Inclusive Smart Society PBL* provided by the Bachelor’s program in Interdisciplinary Engineering.

**Paragraph 2:** According to the Article 4-2, paragraph 3 of the Implementation Guidelines, subjects appointed by the Dean of the School of Science and Engineering in the following table shall be excluded from GPA grading in semester and cumulative GPA of the GPA system of the school.

(Purpose)

(Objective: Cultivation of human resources)

**Article 1-2:** The aim of education in the School of Medicine and Medical Sciences is to train health professionals to develop not only the medical expertise but also the communication skills required for a holistic medicine and researchers in the field of medicine, nursing and medical sciences.

The Department also trains physicians with a rich sense of humanity to promote patient-centered medicine and medical research throughout their lives, with a high level of problem-solving ability and good communication skills.
Nursing	College of Nursing is designed to cultivate outstanding nursing professionals who are founded on the liberal arts in a broad range of areas and the deep understanding of people and thereby can provide quality nursing that meets people's needs in cooperation with others as a member of a health, medical or welfare team and also cultivate the human resources who contribute to the society widely in the areas of health and medicine, such as civil officials and nursing professionals working from an international viewpoint, interdisciplinary researchers and educators who nurture the next generation.
Medical Sciences	College of Medical Sciences educates fundamental knowledge and technical skills in health and medical science. Students are expected to have a sense of mission and responsibility as medical professionals. Graduates will promote research and education, contribute to the advancement of medical care, and engage in advanced specialized medical care to develop new diagnostic and therapeutic technologies.

**Purpose**

**Article 1** The purpose of these Detailed University Regulations shall be to provide for necessary matters concerning admission, educational methodology, graduation and other matters, etc. necessary for the attendance at school of students in the Bachelor’s Program in Global Issues (hereinafter referred to as the “Degree Program”) provided for in Article 46, paragraph 2 of the Regulations of the Basic Organization and Operation of the National University Corporation of the University of Tsukuba (University Regulations No. 1 of 2004), in addition to what is provided for in the University of Tsukuba School Regulations (University Regulations No. 10 of 2004; hereinafter referred to as “School Regulations”).

**Required Duration of Study**

**Article 2** The required duration of study of the Degree Program shall be four years as provided for in Article 2, paragraph 1 of the School Regulations.

**Purposes of Human Resource Development**

**Article 3** The purposes of the Degree Program shall be to cultivate human resources who will acquire broad basic knowledge for gaining an overall perspective of global issues, who will enthusiastically seek on their own necessary information and technology beyond their particular fields to resolve problems related to human beings and the environment, and who are capable of making decisions on optimal solutions from among many options.

**Time of Admission**

**Article 4** Admission shall take place in October.

**Admission Policy**

**Article 5** The University shall select applicants who have an interest in problems of the earth environment (climate change, destruction of nature, pollution, etc.) and human society (food, poverty, longevity of society, etc.) and who can contribute to society and innovation in the future at home countries and abroad through global corporations, international institutions, etc. as they apply their knowledge in the humanities and sciences.

**Transferring between Schools and Colleges or the Degree Program**

**Article 6** Provisions of Article 20 of the School Regulations shall apply correspondingly to students enrolled in the Degree Program who wish to transfer to another school or college, or students enrolled in another school or college who wish to transfer to the Degree Program.

**Treatment of Courses, etc. Already Taken by Mid-Course Entrants and Transferees from Other Schools or Colleges**

**Article 7** In accordance with provisions of Article 22 of the School Regulations, the treatment of courses already taken and the number of credits already earned by students as well as the number of years of enrollment required and the maximum duration of enrollment shall be determined according to the treatment of mid-course entry into the Degree Program and the treatment of transfer from other schools and colleges in the Degree Program.

**Curriculum Design Policy**

**Article 8** The Degree Program shall a curriculum where students will acquire comprehensive knowledge with the clear objective of investigating global issues, adopt an active stance in autonomously gathering and analyzing information necessary for solving problems, and develop global negotiating skills and management expertise.

**Curriculum Design, etc.**

**Article 9** Courses, the number of credits, and methods of taking classes in the Degree Program shall be prescribed in the curriculum design, etc. of the Degree Program (hereinafter referred to as the "Curriculum Design, etc.").

**Major Field**

**Article 10** The major field as prescribed in Article 25 of the School Regulations shall be as indicated in the following table:

**Degree-Granting Policy**

**Article 11** A Bachelor's Degree shall be conferred on students who are enrolled for the prescribed period and who earned the prescribed number of units.

2. A student’s achievement of each of the following items shall serve as a goal for graduating from the Degree Program:

- (1) Acquisition of broad knowledge that enables a broad perspective of global issues from the standpoint of the integration of liberal arts and sciences.
- (2) Acquisition of systematic specialized knowledge in global issues, acquisition of the ability to comprehensively analyze from diverse perspectives and to tackle solutions to problems with creative ingenuity.
- (3) Possession of flexible communication skills to listen carefully to others' opinions while asserting one’s own opinions logically and persuasively in global society, demonstration of positive leadership in different fields and different cultural environments, and acquisition of skills that enable contributions to society.
- (4) Acquisition of high ethical values in global society and ability to understand diversity.

**Methods of Taking Classes, etc.**

**Article 12** The subjects and number of credits required for graduation for each of the major subjects, foundation subjects for the major, and general foundation subjects according to the major field in the Degree Program provided for in Article 39 of the School Regulations shall be as stated in the appended Table.

**Upper Limit on Registration for Subjects**

**Article 13** The upper limit on subjects for which students may register during an academic year

shall be 45 credits as prescribed in Article 33, paragraph 1 of the School Regulations. However, intensive courses held during the summer, winter and spring break periods shall be excluded.

2. The requirements and number of credits in cases where a student is allowed to register for subjects beyond the upper limit as prescribed in Article 33, paragraph 2 of the School Regulations shall be as indicated in the following table:

### Degree Conferral

**Article 14** The University shall confer a Bachelor of Arts and Science degree on students who fulfill graduation requirements for the Degree Program provided for in Article 12.

### Early Graduation

**Article 15** Students eligible for early graduation and the graduation standards as prescribed in Article 40 of the School Regulations shall be as indicated in the following table:

### Organizational Training, etc. for Improving Educational Content, etc.

**Article 16** At faculty development (FD) and staff development (SD) seminars, teaching staff participating in the Degree Program shall exchange opinions and engage in discussion in regard to the purposes of human resources development, the curriculum policy, educational guidance methods, academic assessment, etc. in the Degree Program, and shall engage in the delivery of education with a common understanding.

2. Faculty and staff who participate in the Degree Program shall build cooperative relations among faculty and staff involved in the Degree Program, and shall further enhance activities for guiding students.

### Treatment of Credits including Graduation Thesis Preparation, etc.

**Article 17** In consideration of guidance received and study, etc. undertaken through courses in regard to the preparation, etc. of the graduation thesis, the number of credits granted to students

for such preparation etc. shall be six credits.

### **Grading**

**Article 18** The courses that may use pass (P) or fail (F) as grade marks as prescribed in Article 35, paragraph 3 of the School Regulations shall be *First Year Seminar, Invitation to Arts and Sciences and Information Literacy (Exercises)*.

2. Courses excluded from the semester GPA and cumulative GPA of schools in the GPA system shall not be specified.

### **Miscellaneous Provisions**

**Article 19** In addition to matters prescribed in these Detailed University Regulations, the time for selection of the major field of study, time for applying for early graduation, time for selecting and submitting graduation research, and other necessary matters concerning the study of courses in the Degree Program shall be determined by the Degree Program Leader through discussion of the Degree Program Education Council and officially announced within the University.

### **Supplementary Provisions**

These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from October 19, 2017 and shall be applied from October 1 of said year.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.10 of March 29, 2018)**

1. These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from April 1, 2018.
2. The appended Table applied to students who were admitted to the University prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be in accordance with the previous provisions.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.18 of November 28, 2018)**

1. These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from April 1, 2019.
2. The appended Table applied to students who were admitted to the University prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be in accordance with the previous provisions.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.4 of February 6, 2020)**

1. These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from April 1, 2020.
2. The appended Table applied to students who were admitted to the University prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be in accordance with the previous provisions.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.12 of November 25, 2021)**

1. These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from November 25, 2021 and shall be applied from October 1 of said year.
2. The appended Table applied to students who were admitted to the University prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be in accordance with the previous provisions.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.1 of January 27, 2022)**

1. These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from April 1, 2022.
2. Article 19, paragraph 1 and the appended Table applied to students who were admitted to the University prior to the implementation of these Regulations shall be in accordance with the previous provisions.

#### **Supplementary Provisions (Detailed University Regulations, No.5 of February 27, 2025)**

These Detailed University Regulations shall be implemented from April 1, 2025.

Decision by the Council of Undergraduate Education

Decision by the Council of Graduate Education

(Purpose)

- 1 The implementation of examinations and other appropriate methods (hereinafter referred to as "examinations, etc.") for the course subjects stipulated in Article 34 of the University of Tsukuba School Regulations (Corporate Regulations No. 10 of 2004; hereinafter referred to as the "School Regulations") and Article 35 of the University of Tsukuba Graduate School Regulations (Corporate Regulations No. 11 of 2004; hereinafter referred to as the "Graduate School Regulations") shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of this decision. In addition, the evaluation criteria for grades shall be established in accordance with the provisions of Article 35, Paragraph 4 of the School Regulations and Article 36, Paragraph 5 of the Graduate School Regulations.

(Implementation of Examinations, Etc.)

- 2 Examinations, etc. shall be conducted by instructors in charge of the relevant course subject (hereinafter referred to as the "instructors in charge of courses") during class hours by written, oral, practical, or other methods, or by submitting reports and other assignments. The instructors in charge of courses shall provide feedback on the results.

(Presentation of Student ID)

- 3 Students who take examinations, etc. during class hours (including credited auditors and exchange students (tokubetsu chokogakusei; the same shall apply hereinafter.) shall be required to present their student ID on their desks during class hours, based on the instructions of instructors in charge of courses.

(Report on the Results of Examinations, Etc.)

- 4 In principle, instructors in charge of courses must report the results of the examinations, etc. to the head of the educational organization, etc. that establishes the relevant course subject through the educational information system within two weeks of the last day of the class, using the grades prescribed in Article 35, Paragraph 1 of the School Regulations or Article 36, Paragraph 1 of the Graduate School Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "grades").

(Special Case of Evaluation)

- 5 For a course subject that is taught over two semesters, examinations, etc., shall be given in each semester, the results of which shall be evaluated each time, and an overall evaluation shall be made in the final semester; provided however, that even if the course subject is taught over two semesters, if it is deemed appropriate due to the nature of the subject, it may be evaluated as an overall evaluation over the course of the academic year at the discretion of the educational organization that offers the relevant course subject.

(Make-Up Examinations, Etc.)

- 6 For students who were unable to take examinations, etc. due to illness or other unavoidable reasons, make-up examinations, etc. may be given only when the head of the educational organization offering the relevant course subject deems it particularly necessary.

(Procedures of Make-Up Examinations, Etc.)

- 7 Students who wish to take make-up examinations, etc. must submit a request for make-up examinations, etc. using the designated form to the head of the educational organization offering the course, through the head of the educational organization to which the student belongs, within two weeks from the date of the examinations, etc. For examinations, etc. related to graduation or completion assessments for prospective graduates, the request must be submitted within two days from the date of the examinations, etc.

(Deadlines for Completing Make-Up Examinations)

8 Deadlines for completing make-up examinations, etc. shall be until the second week of the fall semester for examinations, etc. for the spring semester, and until March 25 for examinations, etc. for the fall semester, and within one week after the completion of such examinations, etc. for examinations, etc. for graduation approval for students scheduled to graduate or completion approval for students scheduled to complete their studies.

(Report on the Results of Make-Up Examinations, Etc.)

9 Instructors in charge of courses must report the results of make-up examinations, etc., within one week after the completion of make-up examinations, etc. for examinations, etc. in the spring semester, by March 25 for examinations, etc. in the fall semester, and within two days after the completion of makeup examinations, etc. for examinations, etc. for graduation approval for those scheduled to graduate or for completion approval for those scheduled to complete their studies, by writing the grades to the head of the educational organization, etc. that offers the relevant course subject through the educational information system.

(Notification of Grades)

10 Students will be notified of the results of examinations, etc. at a pre-designated date and time.

(Evaluation Criteria of Grades)

11 The evaluation criteria for the grades used to evaluate the results of examinations, etc., shall be as shown in the appended table.

(Misconduct)

12 In case a student committed misconduct during an examination, etc. after consultation with the Faculty Meeting and Steering Committee of the educational organization, etc. to which the student belongs (for students of the School of Integrative and Global Majors, it is the Faculty Meeting for the School of Integrative and Global Majors; for the School of Physical Education, Health & Sport Sciences and the School of Art & Design, it is the School Faculty Meeting; and for the School of Comprehensive Studies, it is the Steering Committee for the School of Comprehensive Studies. (hereinafter referred to as the "faculty meeting, etc." in Paragraph 16), the head of the educational organization, etc. to which the student belongs shall take any of the following measures.

(1) Invalidation of examination for the course subject

(2) Invalidation of examination for all course subjects of the module in which the relevant course subject is offered

(3) Invalidation of examination for all course subjects of the semester in which the relevant course subject is offered

13 The misconduct mentioned in the preceding paragraph, in addition to the measures stipulated in the same paragraph, is subject to disciplinary action as specified in Article 60 of the School Regulations or Article 66 of the Graduate School Regulations.

(Miscellaneous Provisions)

14 In addition to what is provided for in this decision, matters necessary for the implementation of examinations, etc. shall be determined on a case-by-case basis by the Faculty Meeting, etc.

15 The Guidelines on the Implementation of Examination, Etc. for the School of Transdisciplinary Science and Design and the Law School Program of the Graduate School of Business Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences shall be prescribed separately.

Additional Entries

1 This decision shall be implemented from April 1, 2025.

2 The University of Tsukuba Guidelines on the Implementation of Undergraduate Examination (Ruling by

the Vice President for Education on July 16, 2024) and Handling of the Implementation, Etc. of Course Examination at the Graduate School (Decision by the Council of Graduate Education on March 10, 2020) shall be abolished.

- 3 This decision shall apply mutatis mutandis to the implementation, etc. of examination, etc. in the graduate schools and the master's programs and doctoral programs of such graduate schools that are still governed by the provisions then in force pursuant to the provisions of Article 3 of the Supplementary Provisions of the Corporate Regulations (Corporate Regulations No. 15 of 2019) that partially amend the Regulations Concerning the Basic Organization and Management of the National University Corporation of the University of Tsukuba.

#### 4. Implementation Guidelines for the GPA System of the University of Tsukuba (Undergraduate)

##### (Purpose)

- 1 This ruling further substantiates the educational quality assurance set by the Tsukuba Standard. The purpose is to contribute to appropriate study guidance in addition to reinforcing students' desires to study in undergraduate degree programs. This will be achieved by establishing a system that calculates grade point average (the average value of grades in courses; GPA) at the University of Tsukuba (hereinafter referred to as the "University").

##### (GP)

- 2 The grade point (numerical value granted through evaluation; GP) corresponding to the grade of performance as provided in Article 35 of the University of Tsukuba Undergraduate School Regulations (Corporation Regulations No. 10 of 2004) and University of Tsukuba Examinations, etc. Implementation Guidelines (Ruling of the Council of Undergraduate Education/Council of Graduate Education of February 18, 2025) is as listed in the following table.

##### (Types of GPA and Calculation Methods)

- 3 The types of GPA shall be the GPA that indicates the stage and outcome of achievement in each semester (hereinafter referred to as "Semester GPA") and the GPA that indicates the stage and outcome of achievement in the entire enrollment period (hereinafter referred to as "Cumulative GPA").
- 4 The calculated values shall be rounded off to two decimal places. The calculating formulas for Semester

GPA and Cumulative GPA shall include those listed below.

(1) Calculation method of Semester GPA

NC registered in the relevant semester with

$[(\text{NC with A+}) \times 4.3] + [(\text{NC with A}) \times 4] + [(\text{NC with B}) \times 3] + [(\text{NC with C}) \times 2] \div \text{Total NC attempted} = \text{Semester GPA}$

(2) Calculation method of Cumulative GPA

NC registered in the entire enrollment period with

$[(\text{NC with A+}) \times 4.3] + [(\text{NC with A}) \times 4] + [(\text{NC with B}) \times 3] + [(\text{NC with C}) \times 2] \div \text{Total NC attempted} = \text{Cumulative GPA}$

**(Target Subjects for GPA)**

5 The target subjects for GPA shall be class subjects pertaining to graduation requirements prescribed in the Detailed Regulations for Completion of Educational Organizations.

6 Exceptions to the aforementioned rule shall be the following subjects, which will be excluded from the Semester and Cumulative GPAs.

- (i) Subjects earned at a different university and deemed as credits earned at the University
- (ii) Subjects assessed "P" or "F"
- (iii) Subjects that a dean designates upon request from a chair

7 Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding two paragraphs, for the School of Comprehensive Studies, class subjects other than class subjects in item (i)

**(Rigorous Assessment of Academic Achievement)**

8 The dean, chairman of the expert committee of common subjects established in the committee of common subjects of schools in the Transferable Skills Education Promotion Committee, etc., shall determine and disclose the goal of distribution related to performance evaluation in the college concerned, common subjects concerned, etc., in advance.

**(Academic Achievement Report and Transcript)**

9 The academic achievement report of each semester shall contain Semester GPA and Cumulative GPA.

10 The transcript shall specify the calculation methods of GPA, etc.

**(Miscellaneous Provisions)**

11 In addition to this ruling, any necessary matters related to the implementation of GPA shall be separately prescribed by the Vice President (in charge of education) upon deliberation with the Education Council of the School.

**Note**

This ruling shall be implemented from April 1, 2013, and shall be applied to the students admitted in and after 2013.

**Note (March 17, 2015)**

This ruling shall be implemented from April 1, 2015.

**Note (February 16, 2016)**

This ruling shall be implemented from April 1, 2016.

**Note (October 22, 2020)**

This ruling shall be implemented from April 1, 2021.

**Note (February 18, 2025)**

This ruling shall be implemented from April 1, 2025.

## 5 Q and A on the GPA System for Students

March 2016

[The initial GPA system outline]

- GPA shall be indicated in the transcript, etc., for the undergraduate students admitted in and after 2013.
- Grade A shall be divided into A<sup>+</sup> and A, and grades shall be indicated with a 5-grade evaluation, A<sup>+</sup>, A, B, C, and D.
- Subjects given up shall be assessed D or F.

[Changes from the 2016 academic year]

GP (Grade Point) shall be revised as follows from April 1, 2016.

- New GP will be applicable to all the undergraduate students enrolled in and after 2013.
- Revision of GPA will be retroactively effective to the past. The “Semester GPA” and “Cumulative GPA” until AY 2015, which have already been calculated so far, will be recalculated based on the new system.
- The GPA indicated in Grade inquiry screen at TWINS, Certificate of Academic record and Notification of grades for parents will be the recalculated results based on the new system after April 1, 2016.
- The old GP system was used to calculate the GPA on the Notification of grades for fall semester in AY 2015; however, the GPA grades displayed at TWINS will be recalculated based on the new system from April 2016. New Notification of grades for 2016 spring semester will be sent to the parents by explaining this new GPA system (September 2016).

Q1: What is GPA?

A1: It refers to grade point average, one of the evaluation methods for students’ achievements in the U.S. Each subject shall be graded with multiple steps for evaluation, and each grade shall be given. GPA is the average point of these grade points.

If there are more “A<sup>+</sup>s” or “As” and fewer “Cs” or “Ds,” then the value of the GPA becomes big (good). Giving up subjects means to increase the number of “Ds,” and the value of the GPA becomes small (bad). Therefore, obtaining good points for the registered subjects is

essential.

Q2: What is the purpose of introducing the GPA system?

A2: Specifying the situation of academic achievement enables students to make the registration plan best appropriate for them. It ensures the educational quality assurance set by Tsukuba Standard.

Q3: When will the GPA system start?

A3: The GPA system will be applied to the students admitted in and after 2013.

GPA is not to be calculated or described for the students admitted before 2013. Time of introduction of GPA to the Graduate School is not decided yet.

Q4: Where can I find the GPA?

A4: You can confirm it on TWINS and Notification of grades for parents along with the grades.

Q5: Is there any change in the assessment standards of academic achievement?

A5: Yes. The grades and standards of academic achievement will be changed from 2013, as indicated in the chart below. In the Undergraduate and Graduate School, the assessment of academic achievement will be conducted with a 5-grade evaluation.

A<sup>+</sup>, A, B, C, and P are passing grades, and credits are to be given. D and F are failing grades, and credits are not to be given. Until 2012, when students stop attending classes and give up subjects, TWINS shows “—” instead of “D”; however, from 2013, when students give up subjects, they fail (D or F) for whatever reasons.

Q6: Is it possible to cancel the course registration?

A6: It is possible to cancel the course registration on TWINS within the course registration period. After the period, it cannot be canceled. In case of any unavoidable grounds, please submit the Request for the Change of Registered Subject to the dean of the school.

Q7: Is there any effect of failing the registered subject?

A7: For the students admitted before 2013, failed subjects have not been shown and will not be indicated in the transcript, etc., so the fact is not open to a third party.

For the students admitted in and after 2013, even though the failed subjects will not be indicated in the transcript like before, GPA might reveal failed subjects (Failed subjects will include the denominator of GPA calculation).

Q8: What are the target subjects for GPA calculation?

A8: Target subjects include subjects relating to the graduation requirements set in the Detailed Undergraduate Registration Regulations. Even if the subjects are included in the graduation requirements, subjects earned in the other university and certified by the University or subjects assessed “P” or “F” are to be excluded. In addition to these, if more subjects are to be excluded, they shall be specified in the Detailed School Registration Regulations for each school and college.

Q9: What are the calculation methods for GPA?

A9: GPA shall be calculated using the target subjects for GPA. “Semester GPA” is the index that shows the outcome of academic achievement in the relevant semester being calculated with GPs of the target subjects at the basic point of time (on the designated date). “Cumulative GPA”

is the index that shows the outcome of academic achievement in the entire enrollment period since the entrance being calculated with GPs of all target subjects since the entrance.

The calculation formula is as follows:

$$\text{GPA} = \frac{\text{"NC with A}^+ \times 4.3 + \text{NC with A} \times 4 + \text{NC with B} \times 3 + \text{NC with C} \times 2 + \text{NC with D} \times 0\text{"}}{\text{"Number of all credits registered in the relevant semester"}}$$

\*NC = Number of Credits

GPA is calculated to two decimal places, rounding down the third decimal place.

For reference, an example of the simple calculation is indicated below. Semester GPA in the spring semester for a new student is the same value as Cumulative GPA. However, they may be different after the fall semester.

Q10: Is my GPA displayed on the Certificate of Academic Record?

A10: You can choose the presence or absence of GPA on the Certificate, and you have to mention every time when you apply for the certificate.

Q11: When is GPA calculated?

A11: Semester GPA and Cumulative GPA shall be calculated on the designated date right after the deadline for the input of grades for Spring C and Fall C. In case of any change in the grades after the aforementioned date, it will not affect the Semester GPA; however, Cumulative GPA for the next time will be calculated based on the changed grades.

Q12: Are there any influences/effects on GPA in case any subject is ungraded?

A12: In such a case, those subjects will not be included in GPA calculation; however, when the grading is done, it will be handled in the same way as in the previous section.

Q13: Multidisciplinary Subjects and Physical Education are classified as second choice due to the restriction of registration. Are these the target subjects for GPA calculation?

A13: Yes, these are target subjects for GPA calculation. There is no association between closed classes and the assessment of academic achievement.

Q14: Are subjects held by other School/College targets for the GPA calculation?

A14: In principle, all subjects that are targets for the graduation requirements are the targets for GPA calculation. Subjects not included in the target subjects for GPA calculation are specified in the Detailed School Registration Regulations.

Q15: Are the subjects related to qualification targets for the GPA calculation?

A15: If a subject is offered for qualification acquisition, included in the graduation requirements, and not excluded from the target subjects for GPA calculation, it is a target for GPA calculation.

Q16: Do grades earned overseas or at other universities reflect in GPA?

A16: No, these cannot be included in GPA because the assessment standards of other universities may not be the same as those of the University of Tsukuba. The credits earned before admission to the University cannot be included either.

Q17: What will GPA be used for?

A17: It is assumed to be mainly used for study guidance.

Q18: In case the GPA does not reach a certain level, will an admonishment of leaving school be issued?

A18: We do not assume such a usage at the moment.

Q19: If I repeat a subject, which grade will be reflected in the GPA?

A19: Both grades will be targets for calculation. The number of repeated subjects will be added to the denominator.
