





WHY

This Challenge Exists

Humanitarian and development finance continue to generate strong research, pilots, and policy discussions. Yet many solutions struggle to move from concept to implementation.

Gaps in funding readiness, institutional alignment, and operational feasibility often prevent promising ideas from achieving real-world impact.

This Challenge was created to address that disconnect by surfacing implementable ideas and connecting them directly with institutions capable of piloting, funding, and scaling them.

Participants engage in structured dialogue with funders, practitioners, and policymakers to refine ideas within real-world constraints and explore pathways toward piloting and scale.



Call for Ideas

The Challenge invites researchers, practitioners, and sector professionals from the MENA and Southeast Asia regions to submit ideas addressing key challenges in humanitarian and development finance, particularly in fragile and crisis-affected contexts.

Aligned with the Humanitarian and Development Finance Forum, the Innovation Challenge connects academia, practice, and philanthropy to turn credible ideas into implementable initiatives that advance inclusion, resilience, and measurable impact.





WHO Should Participate

- Academics and Researchers
- Humanitarian and Development Practitioners
- Policy Professionals
- Individuals active within non-profit, waqf, or development finance ecosystems

Eligibility Applicants must be based in, or primarily working in, the MENA and Southeast Asia regions.

Submission Overview

Submissions should include:

- Problem statement
- Why the problem persists
- Scale and impact
- Proposed solution
- Estimated cost to build or pilot
- Supporting slides (up to 12 slides)

Shortlisted teams will be invited to present their ideas live to funders and ecosystem stakeholders as part of the programme.

Awards and Strategic Opportunities

Top 3 performing teams will be formally recognised.

Further recognition details will be announced soon.

Opportunities may include:

- Up to **US\$100,000 investment** through the HASAN VC Accelerator
- Fast-track admission into Accelerator Cohort 4
- Investor introductions and fundraising preparation
- Access to HASAN VC Venture Capital Certification Programmes

What Happens After the Challenge

The Challenge is designed as a starting point.

Selected ideas may progress into:

- Structured refinement
- Incubation pathways
- Engagement with aligned funders and institutions
