Transport and Supply Chain Management Bridging (1 Year)

Students are required to do a bridging programme and can ONLY then continue with the NSPs in the Department of Transport and Supply Chain Management. After completing the Bridging Programme you may continue with the Diploma in Road Transport Management / Diploma in Transportation Management / Diploma in Logistics Management. Diploma in Transportation Management

REQUIREMENT: Matric Certificate with Diploma endorsement OR Grade 12 with Transport and Supply Chain Management Bridging Study schools in Johannesburg / Durban / Cape Town. Examination in 9 Examination Centres

Diploma in Road Transport Management (Freight / Passengers)

REQUIREMENT: Matric Certificate with Diploma endorsement OR Grade 12 with Transport and Supply Chain Management Bridging Study schools in Johannesburg / Durban / Cape Town. Examination in 9 Examination Centres.

Diploma in Logistics Management

REQUIREMENT: Matric Certificate with Diploma endorsement OR Grade 12 with Transport and Supply Chain Management Bridging. Study schools and examination only in Johannesburg. * Limited space.

Diploma graduates **meeting the minimum entry requirements** can apply for the Advanced Diploma corresponding with the specialisation of the completed diploma.
Diploma graduates **NOT meeting the minimum entry requirements** for the Advanced Diploma programmes, can apply for the Bridging programme into the Advanced Diploma corresponding with the specialisation of the completed diploma.

WHAT MAKES THE TRANSPORT AND SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT BRIDGING PROGRAMME UNIQUE?

EASY ADMISSION

- Students with a Grade 12 Certificate to pursue a career in Transport or Logistics.
- The programme has been developed to allow prospective students who possess a Grade 12 Certificate without Diploma endorsement/university exemption, to improve their qualification in order to be able to articulate to the following Non-Subsidised Whole Programmes in this Department
 - Diploma in Road Transport Management (Freight)
 - Diploma in Road Transport Management (Passenger)
 - Diploma in Transportation Management
 - Diploma in Logistics Management
- This programme is unique to the Department of Transport and Supply Chain Management at the University of Johannesburg. It has been developed in consultation with the Transport and Logistics Industry in order to allow students to improve their career advancement prospects in the industry.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Grade 12 with higher certificate endorsement / without university exemption.
- A good working knowledge of English is essential (learning material, assignments and examination papers are available in English only).
- Relevant documentation (see how to apply).
- **An internet-enabled digital device with data, is required e.g. laptop or desktop computer (preferably not a cellphone**

or tablet) for teaching and learning, and the submission of assignments online.

- **Computer literacy is essential.**

AFFORDABILITY

The programme offers a unique, affordability, cost-effective opportunity to students.

CONVENIENCE

- **Study from the comfort of your own home** when applying for a Non-Subsidised Programme (NSP) at the Department of Transport and Supply Chain Management.
- Examination are written at various examination centres across South Africa. Examination centres are in Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town.
- Easy access via the UJ website on the Student Portal to submit assignments, obtain assessment results, etc. For this reason, internet access is essential.
- Limited space available, therefore registration will be determined by space availability.

CURRICULUM

Basic Mathematics and Quantitative Techniques for Logisticians:

TSCB1Y1

This module follows a practical training approach, in which students are introduced to the role and importance of quantitative techniques in logistics management as well as the teaching of basic mathematical and quantitative skills required in logistics management.

Industrial Relations: TSCB2Y1

This module familiarises students with the basic theoretical and practical foundation underlying industrial relations in South Africa. The module provides grounding in management philosophy, the role of the State, constitutional principles, trade unions, collective bargaining, negotiations, recognition agreements, strikes, unfair labour practices, etc. The implications of various management approaches for optimising industrial relations in the future are covered, and case studies are used to provide opportunities for the practical application of the principles discussed.

Managing Road Transport Operation: TSCB3Y1

This module gives students the ability to understand an organisation and make supervisory decisions on a visionary basis. It allows students to understand the organising and use of resources. The components of management are covered and related to transport. The application of managerial concepts to work teams is studied and explained.

ASSESSMENT (Assignments and examinations)

- Students will be required to submit two assignments per module online on due dates provided by the Department.
- Submissions of assignments is compulsory in order to gain access to the examination.
- The examination is written during October and students will be required to write one examination paper per module.
- Examination is written over three days.
- The examination is a sit-down invigilated examination to be written at any of the approved examination centres in South Africa only. These examination centres are in Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town.

- A subminimum of 40% is required in the examination paper in order to pass a module.
- A combined final mark of 50% is required to pass a module. (assignment mark and examination mark).
- The assignment mark will count 25% and the examination mark will count 75% towards the final mark for the specific module.
- A student may be granted a supplementary examination opportunity in accordance with the criteria determined by the University.

PROGRESSION

On completion of the Bridging Programme, a student will be able to apply for a Non-Subsidised Whole Programme within the Department of Transport and Supply Chain Management, as indicated on page two.

- A student may be granted a supplementary examination opportunity in accordance with the criteria determined by the University. Should a student not pass all the modules he/she will NOT be allowed to enroll for the following programmes
 - Diploma in Transportation Management
 - Diploma in Road Transport Management Freight
 - Diploma in Road Transport Management Passenger
 - Diploma in Logistics Management
- Marks may be retained for a maximum period of seven (7) years, provided that there have been no material changes to the curriculum.
- Students who have completed this bridging programme will only be allowed to articulate into the following programmes (see table on next page):

- Students have the opportunity to attend study schools for the modules they are registered for.
- These study schools are conducted in Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town respectively.
- The duration of the study schools is four (4) consecutive days only.
- Details regarding these study schools will be made available to registered students.
- Students are responsible for their own refreshments, meals, travel and accommodation arrangements.
- Study schools will be online should lockdown restrictions occur in 2026.


