

- Master Economie et Finance (MEF) at Université Paris Dauphine- PSL

4<sup>th</sup> semester:

- Either at the Faculty in Paris or in Frankfurt

## 1<sup>st</sup> semester (October – February):

30 CP (ECTS)

- Fundamentals of Microeconomics (6 CP)
- Fundamentals of Macroeconomics (6 CP)
- Fundamentals of Econometrics (6 CP)
- Capital Markets and Asset Pricing (6 CP)
- “Finance” (6 CP)



## 2<sup>nd</sup> semester (April – July):

30 CP (ECTS)

- 1 module and 1 seminar in “Monetary Economics and Macroeconomics” (12 CP, 6 CP each)
- 1 module and 1 seminar in “Finance” (12 CP, 6 CP each)
- 2 modules in “Supplementaries” (6 CP, 3 CP each)

# Course of Studies



3<sup>rd</sup> semester (September – December):

30 CP (ECTS)

- Course program specialization „Magistère Banque Finance Assurance“ and „Energie Finance Carbone“

6 CP (ECTS)

- Internship and internship report


4<sup>th</sup> semester (April – July):

24 CP (ECTS)

- Master thesis seminar (usually obligatory in the same semester as the master thesis registration) is recognized for the 36 CP obtained in Paris. However, attendance of research seminar without CP is highly recommended
- Master Thesis according to the examination rules of the Faculty

# Internship

- The internship can take place in any country, however, it is strongly recommend to do it in France
- Students are free to choose their internship but it should fit to the students' professional orientation. It may be in the field of Finance or Economics
- The internship has a length of 2 - 6 months including an internship report afterwards
- The grade for the 6 CP is given on the basis of the written internship report. There is no defense of the report in front of a jury

# Requirements for Taking Part in the Program

## Semester 1

- Application
- 30 CP (ECTS) consisting of 3 Fundamental Modules in:
  - “Macroeconomics”,
  - “Microeconomics”,
  - “Econometrics” (18 CP),
  - “Capital Markets and Asset Pricing” (6 CP) and “Finance” (6 CP)

## Semester 2

- 30 CP (ECTS): 1 module and 1 seminar in “Monetary Economics and Macroeconomics.” (12 CP), 1 modules and 1 seminar in “Finance” (12 CP), 2 “Fundamental Modules” (6 CP)

## Additional

- Language qualification in English (language of the program)

**It is essential to put a lot of effort into completing all modules during semester 1 and 2 in Frankfurt!**

# Selection of Participants

- The home institution is responsible for the selection of the participants. There is a total of 5 places in each direction.
- Selection criteria:
  - Academic achievements: Bachelor grades
  - Social commitment
  - Motivation
  - Overall quality of the application
