Study environmental and urban change from the perspective of urban planning. The Planning Program educates future planners for careers as changemakers in shaping cities and regions across Canada and around the world. The Planning Program is part of the Master in Environmental Studies interdisciplinary, research-based program, where students learn about the relational nature of environmental, socio-spatial, cultural, economic, legal, and political forces that define urbanization. Students create individualized programs based on their interests, working closely with faculty advisors to develop analytical and practice-oriented professional skills.
