



A T Edwards Memorial Prize

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The A T Edwards Memorial Prize is awarded to the student who during the Doctor of Medicine (MD) program, has demonstrated a command of research and an interest in ongoing learning of the speciality of Psychiatry.
- b. This Prize was established in 1985 and funded by a donation from the family of Dr Alfred Theophilus Edwards. This Prize was supplemented in 2007 with additional gifts from the family in memory of Dr Lawrence Alfred Edwards, son of Dr A.T. Edwards.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. Applicants must be enrolled in the final year of the Doctor of Medicine (MD) at the University of Sydney.
- b. Applicants must have completed their Year 3 Doctor of Medicine (MD) research project on a topic related to Psychiatry and completed the full 8-weeks of their Year 4 Elective Term in Psychiatry.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded for demonstrated aptitude in advanced study in the field of Psychiatry on the basis of:
 - I. level of performance on a research project submitted as part of their Doctor of Medicine (MD) research project block, and
 - II. satisfactory completion of their elective term in Psychiatry and the associated elective term reflective report, and
 - III. supervisor assessment from their Year 3 Psychiatry and Addiction Medicine (PAAM) term.
- b. The recipient(s) will be determined by the Head of School and Dean of the Sydney Medical School, or their nominated delegate(s), on the recommendation of the Head of the Discipline of Psychiatry.

4. Value

- a. The Prize has a value of \$500 and will be paid as a one-off payment.
- b. If more than one student is of equal merit, the value of the prize may be shared.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.

5. Ongoing Eligibility

- a. None apply.

6. Termination

- b. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- c. Once withdrawn the Prize will not be reinstated unless due to University error.
