

Evaluation criteria for Master track Management in the Built Environment Intake 2026-2028

At MBE we put particular emphasis on the candidate's motivation, which we want to see clearly written in the motivation letter. Please check the [general TUD requirements](#) on the contents of the motivation letter. Please show in your application that you have a good understanding of what the [MBE track entails](#). The applicant is expected to refrain from AI. Any use of AI in the application package should be clearly referenced.

Portfolio and Letter of Motivation give the following profile of the applicant:

- a) The applicant shows a strong motivation and interest in management issues in the built environment.
- b) The applicant has the ability to present and express ideas and has the correct use of English.
- c) The documents produced by the applicant explain the applicant's individual approach and critical position.
- d) The applicant's knowledge, strengths, and experience, as shown in the CV, scores and references, are consistent with the competencies identified in the portfolio.
- e) The applicant shows evidence of his/her skills and competencies as a designer, engineer and manager, particularly analytical skills, capacity for synthesis, and use of tools and techniques.
- f) In the portfolio, the applicant shows a sufficient variety of projects to demonstrate that his/her knowledge from previous education and experience links with the existing programmes/tracks of the Faculty of Architecture and the Built Environment at TU Delft *.

** Given the nature of track Management in the Built Environment we accept that projects in the portfolio will likely have limited links to management issues.*

All criteria must be met. Failing on one of them can lead to a rejection.
