

Publication Subvention Fund for English PhD Students and Alumni

The Harvard English Department is pleased to offer current doctoral students and graduates of our doctoral program access to publication subventions, supported by the Rollins Fund. This is a new endeavor, meant to support students' transition from doctoral work to the next phase of their scholarly careers. Please read the terms below prior to filling out the form. Terms

- One-time grants of up to \$3000 are available to each current graduate student or alum. (Requests for smaller amounts are, of course, welcome.)
 - Current graduate students receiving grants less than \$3000 will be eligible to use the remainder after graduation, on the below terms.
- If the applicant has graduated and is employed in a tenure-track position, they must have received their PhD within the past five years. If the applicant has graduated and is not currently employed on the tenure track, they must have received their PhD within the past seven years.
- The applicant must demonstrate that the funds cannot be obtained in other ways—from the press, from professional organizations, from home institutions, from rights-holders, etc.
- The applicant must submit a completed application, including documentation of other funds sought and denied or a description of unsuccessful avenues explored.
- The applicant must submit invoices to the department for direct payment to vendors/suppliers.
- The fund may only be used (a) to pay for image or text reproduction rights/publishing costs for a major academic publication directly tied to the student's scholarship (e.g., a first monograph) or (b) to cover open access fees.
- If you believe you have a reasonable request not covered by (a) or (b) or in excess of the maximum grant amount, please contact the Director of Graduate Studies.
