**This transfer course sheet is applicable for applicants applying between August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 and October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2026.**

- Applicants must have completed MATH 140, MATH 142, and ACCT 2301/2401 (or equivalent to these courses).
- A minimum of one courses (3 hours) must also be taken from the Required Coursework list: AGECE 105, ECON 202, ECON 203, ACCT 230. **Must earn a grade of B or higher in all required coursework.**
- **Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of a 3.25 or higher.**
- Grades lower than B for required coursework are included in the GPA calculation, but are allowable provided a B or better is eventually achieved in the same course. For example, a D in MATH 1324 in Fall 2025 will count towards GPA, but a B or better in MATH 1324 in Spring 2026 is needed to meet the required coursework above.
- In your essay, please be sure to address how an Agribusiness degree will help you meet your career goals. If you have 3 or more grades of D's, F's, Q's, NG's and/or W's explain why the grades occurred.

**Coursework Timeline**

- Competitive applicants must have all required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the spring term should have all required coursework completed by the end of Summer II before applying.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Applicants for summer/fall **may be** asked to submit spring final grades; this is not a guarantee.

**Additional Transfer Requirements**

- The Department of Agricultural Economics is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. Students should indicate our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is intent on pursuing our degree.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.
- **If you would like to be considered for the Agriculture Economics major in the event that you are denied admission to the Agribusiness program, Agricultural Economics must be listed on your application as your second choice major.**
- We recommend meeting with an academic advisor prior to submitting the application.

**Additional Information**

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in the Department of Agricultural Economics.
- Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

**Career & Educational Opportunities**

The Bachelor of Science degree in Agribusiness combines selected Core Business Knowledge classes from a degree in Business with coursework emphasizing the understanding of the unique institutional and managerial challenges facing agribusiness firms. By integrating business management principles with applied technical knowledge, students develop practical decision-making skills to address challenges facing agribusiness firms in the production, processing and distribution of food and fiber in Texas, the nation, and the world. Students are prepared to work in both traditional agribusinesses and non-agricultural companies.
