- Only one of the following will satisfy the requirements for a degree: STAT 201, STAT 301, STAT 302 and STAT 303.

Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the Required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester prior to submitting application.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- The Department of Agricultural Leadership, Education, and Communications is looking for students who are interested in completing the Agricultural Communications and Journalism degree.
- Agricultural Communications and Journalism is **NOT** a transitional major.
- It is recommended the essay and supporting materials should reflect interest and/or experience in Communications and Journalism.

- Meeting minimum requirements **does not** guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in Agricultural Communications and Journalism.
- Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.
- Contacting an academic advisor in this department is strongly recommended prior to application.
- Due to course sequencing and prerequisites, the Agricultural Communications and Journalism major will require a minimum of five long semesters; Fall and Spring, at Texas A&M University to complete the Major Coursework.

Career & Educational Opportunities

One of the few majors of its kind in the nation, this major focuses on writing, editing, publications production, public relations, and web communications. Students in this program gain real-world knowledge in print, broadcast, and web communications.
