  - All currently enrolled students are eligible

  - Up to \$500
  - Must be eligible through financial aid

# Purpose of McBurney Center

- Disability-related accommodations for students providing access to education
- Have a disability as defined by ADA
- Submit documentation (diagnosis and symptoms)
- Interactive process with a McBurney Access Consultant



# Common Accommodations

- Testing accommodations
- Note-taking Accommodations
- Limited flexibility (attendance, exam dates, deadlines)
- Emotional Support Animals
- McBurney consults
  - Note taking skills
  - Reading skills
  - Study and Learning Skills program (SLSS)
- Advocacy

- Survivor Services


**Access appointments are not needed if:**


