FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT TABLE

Full-time enrollment or approved ISS Reduced Course Load (RCL) is required for your F-1 immigration status.

- Undergraduate students: minimum 12 credits (at least 9 credits must be "in-person")
- Graduate students: minimum 8 credits (at least 5 credits must be "in-person")
- Graduate TA/PA 33%: minimum 6 credits (at least 3 credits must be "in-person")
- Graduate TA/PA 50%: minimum 4 credits (at least 1 credit must be "in-person")
- Graduate RA 33%-50%: minimum 8 credits (at least 5 credits must be "in-person")
- Dissertator: minimum 3 credits (at least 3 credits must be "in-person")

Exploring Online Enrollment Options

UW-Madison has a limited number of online courses each semester. You may work with your [academic dean's office](#) to see if there are online courses appropriate for your degree program. However, online courses may not be an option.
